Some Girls Have Lost Femininity, Model Says

"A lot of girls have lost their ability to be feminine."

That's the opinion of Carole Marsh, a professional model who has come to Asheville to set up a modeling agency and a finishing class for Blanton's Business Col-

"Many are getting away from being feminine and some schools are concerned with it," she said. "A lot of girls when they are exposed to it find they can be proud of being feminine and being a woman." She added that wearing skirts too short and wearing pants both have helped to defeminize the school

Mrs. Marsh has been invited by several local schools to talk to the girls about problems. Skirt lengths, hair styles and visual poise such as poor sitting,

standing and hand positions are some of the areas girls ask about, she said.

The natural look is the appearance to have, Mrs. Marsh advises the students. She suggests not wearing eye shadow during the day and not using false eyelashes which pull at the evelid and cause wrinkles. She also tells the girls to keep the hair away from the face, keep the face clean and not cover it with makeup.

Teenagers are concerned with weight problems but she is against crash diets. She tells them to eat well. "The good habits you have now will affect you later," she said.

Besides advising the girls, Mrs. Marsh has another purpose for visiting the schools. She is looking for the top 15 seniors in Western North Carolina to be in her first professional modeling course. So far she has found only one girl who will qualify, she said.

She will also teach a six-

week finishing or charm course beginning this summer which will be open to everyone, Outside activities such as shopping trips will be included, she said.

Mrs. Marsh, a 5 - foot blonde, is originally from Brevard. She began her career when she was chosen fourth runner up in the Miss North Carolina Pageant in 1967.

She was named Miss Atlanta for Universal Pictures in 1968. Since then she and her husband, Robert, who is vice president of Saxon Tires, Inc., have lived in Boston, San Francisco and Phoenix. She did various types of modeling work in a city.

She has done television commercials, sales films for companies, national magazine advertisements, and convention modeling. She also was an extra in the film "Strawberry Statement.


