

Over 70 Rural Development Clubs Enter WNC Improvement Contest

Transylvania Has Entered 7 Communities

A total of 72 organized community clubs in 13 counties and the Cherokee Indian Reservation have entered the 1971 Western North Carolina Community Development Program, according to Morris L. McLaughlin, executive vice president of the Asheville Agricultural Development Council and Jack Krause of Union Mills, area chairman of the program.

Seven communities in Transylvania county are participating in the program this year. These are Cathey's Creek, Cedar Mountain, Lake Toxaway, Little River, Quebec, Sapphire Whitewater and Silverteen.

The community development program, now in its 22nd year is a program of competition among organized rural areas.

Objective of the program is to encourage people to plan together and cooperate in building better communities in which to live. Each community develops and carries out improvements according to their needs. Over the years a tremendous variety of projects have been completed.

The development program is sponsored by the agricultural agencies in each county in cooperation with local sponsors and the Agricultural Development Council, Area award totaling nearly \$6,000 will be awarded next fall to the communities that make the most progress. Over \$10,000 in local awards will be presented in various counties.

Communities will be divided into three divisions for judging. One division is for those communities with less than 75 families, another for 75 to 150 families and one for those with over 150 families. All communities will be judged on the basis of community-wide projects, youth programs, better family living and increased income.

There is also a special contest involving youth programs and another for roadside improvement. A total of 59 areas entered the roadside contest.
