acre home sites will go on sale July 1 when fully furnished model homes will be on display. The sales office is now under construction overlooking Connestee Falls just five miles south of Brevard on U.S. 276. Also under construction are the first phase of a motel and restaurant to be built astride the brook that leads to the head of the falls.

Preliminary plans call for a championship 18-hole golf course, rustic club house, swimming pool, tennis court, riding-hiking-bicycle trail, and equestrian center, and camping area. Paved roads and water service will be extended throughout the community.

The famous Connestee Falls will be left in their natural state for enjoyment of all, Mr. Whitcomb said. The renowned attraction is actually two separate falls in a "y" shape which meet in a spectacular cascade.

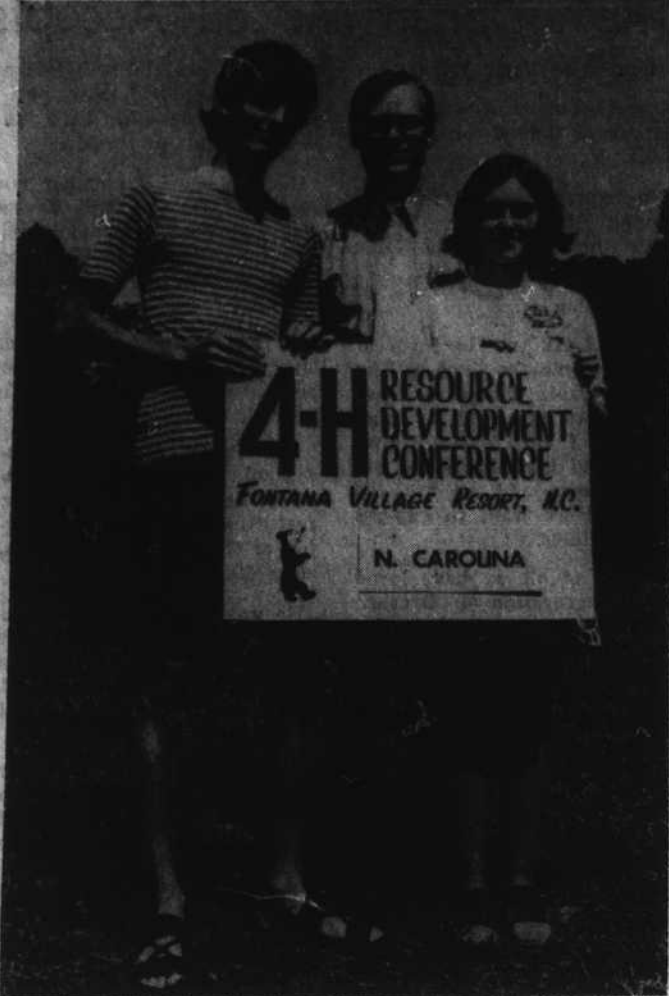
"We feel that Connestee Falls is the most exciting opportunity for happy second-home living that has been offered in the Southeast," said Mr. Whitcomb. "Realtec and

"Strong emphasis is now placed on parent involvement, health services, and staff training (including career development)," explained Mrs. Robertson. "Head Start parents assist in designing the Head Start budget proposal, hire personnel, and serve as paid and volunteer staff in the program."

"As part of the health program, each child is provided with a medical and dental examination, and treatment when needed. A health education program is also made available to each child and his parents."

"Inservice training for the Head Start staff during the coming year will include the beginning of a series of college courses provided locally through the combined efforts of the Blue Ridge Technical Institute and Mars Hill College. A Career Development Committee, composed of representatives of all levels of Head Start staff, continually seeks to discover innovative methods for upgrading present staff as well as recognizing and motivating good work performance," Mrs. Robertson concluded.

# Services Begin Sunday At Saint Andrews By-The-Lake

Saint Andrew's by-the-Lake, the lovely open air chapel at Lake Toxaway, will open for the summer this Sunday, June 13th. The Reverend Luther Lawing, from Brevard College, will be the guest minister for the opening service at 11:00.

The chapel was first started as an extension program of St. Philip's Episcopal church of Brevard but is now an independent chapel. St. Andrews has been supported by summer residents and tourists in the Lake Toxaway area as well as by many residents of Brevard and the surrounding area.

From early June through late September, services are held each Sunday at 11:00 a.m., followed by a coffee hour. Everyone is invited to attend.

For the past six years, Reverend Lawing and his family have lived in Brevard, where he is a member of the faculty of Brevard college and teaches religion. Before coming to Brevard, Mr. Lawing was the Chaplain at the North Carolina Memorial Hospital at Chapel Hill. He attended the University of North Carolina and Duke University.

The chapel is located on Highway #281, just a minute off U.S. 64 and overlooking the lake at Toxaway, with the mountains forming a background for the altar.
