

Rev. Hutchinson Elected As A Delegate To Jurisdictional Conference Of Methodists

The Rev. Orion N. Hutchinson, Jr., Minister of Brevard's First United Methodist Church, was elected a Delegate to the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference of the United Methodist Church.

This action was taken by members of the Western North Carolina Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church in their balloting on last Saturday night.

Mr. Hutchinson becomes part of a delegation of 15 ministers and 15 laymen who join those elected delegates to the General Conference of the United Methodist Church to form the total delegation to the Jurisdictional Conference.

The Jurisdictional Conference will meet at Lake Junaluska on July 11th - 16th, 1972. This Conference which meets every four years develops program priorities and elects leadership, including Bishops, for the southeastern states. Election of the delegates who represent Conferences is done by balloting without nomination, continued until a person or persons obtains a majority vote.

Mr. Hutchinson was appointed at the Annual Conference session to First Church, Brevard, for his second year. He is Chairman of the Board of Christian Social Concerns of the Conference and Vice-Chairman of the Quadrennial Emphasis Committee.

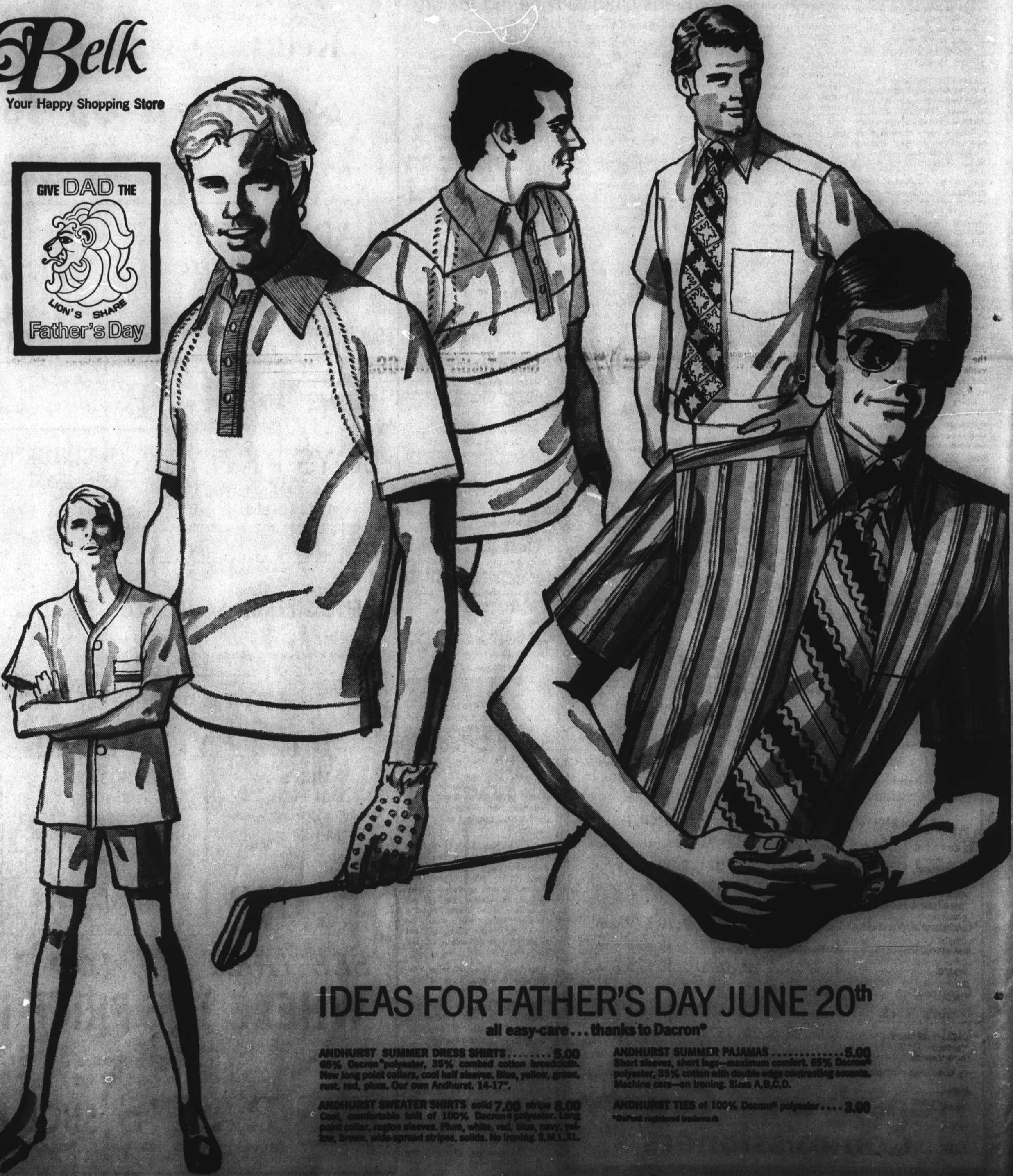
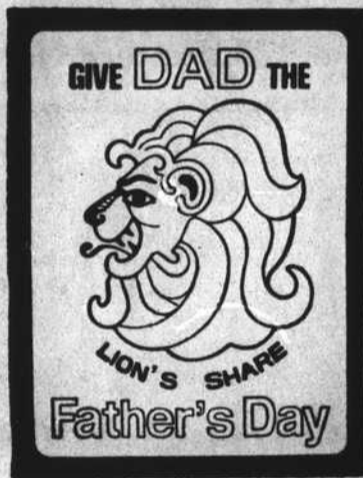
