Most area music lovers know the Brevard Music Center as a necca for the performing arts. At Brevard Festival weekends during July and August they see and hear polished performances by renowned guest soloists, stunning opera produc-tions, lilting musical comedies plus a potpourri of art exhibiions, dance recitals and related arts activities.

But as professional as all BMC performances are, professionalism is not arrived at easily. Long years of study and practice are required, and behind every memorable symphonic performance or opera staging there are innumerable hours of study and practice, practice, practice.

First and foremost, the Music Center is an educational institution. Each summer, 300 of the best of the nation's student musicians come here to study and learn under some of the best professional musicians anywhere. For every three students there is one teacher, and this unique ratio provides the inspiration and guidance that stimulate the student toward professionalism.

All day long at the Music Center students study and practice; sometimes in groups, sometimes along with their instruments. In their dormitories, in private practice huts and sometimes just under a secluded tree in the woods or by a woodland stream, they work to make beautiful music for the performance coming up soon.
