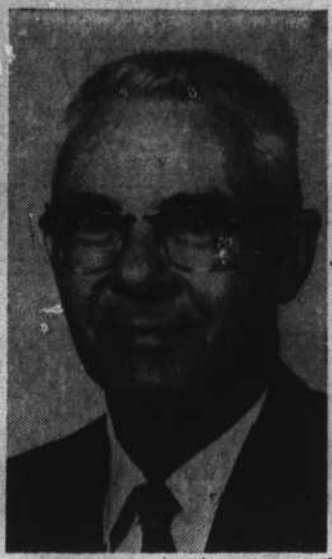

Two Transylvania Teachers To Make Study-Tour Of North Africa

Two Transylvania County teachers have been selected by Western Carolina University to participate in a study-tour of North Africa this summer.

They are Mrs. Paula Lyday of Rt. 2 and Mr. Donald C. Crawford of 201 Southview Dr.

Mrs. Metzger teaches at Rosman Junior High School. She received the bachelor of arts degree and the bachelor of science in education degree from WCU.

Mr. Crawford teaches at T. C. Henderson School. He presently is enrolled in the master's degree program at WCU.

The special WCU program, planned for 30 persons, is supported by a U. S. Office of Education grant. It is designed to place selected educators in Morocco and Tunisia for a concentrated five-week study of the culture, art, history, and geography of the two Arabic countries.

Visits will be made to such historical places as Tunis, Cathage, Utica, Dougga, Bizerte, Sousse, and Sfax. Lectures will be given by local country natives and the WCU faculty members.

Following the conclusion of the study tour, individual members of the group will have the opportunity to stop for several days in Europe before returning to the United States.

The educator participants will serve as special resource persons in their respective school systems during the coming school year to help plan and implement studies on North Africa.

Now Playing At The Playhouse "Man With Expensive Tastes"

For their second production of the season the Flat Rock Playhouse is presenting "The Man With Expensive Tastes," London's smash-hit, crime play, by Edward Percy and Lillian Wenham.

The play deals with a gang of international crooks and builds to an exciting climax. Forgery is the theme of the plot, hypnotism is the means, and audiences have been highly intrigued with the thrilling development. It has all the ingredients of a first-class crime play, and the stage is full of interesting, well-developed characters.

Portraying the exhibitionist forger, a lover of good things who must have money for his

expensive tastes, is Richard Hudson. His Cockney brother, Alfred, is played by Walter Williamson. Both are making their first appearance on the Flat Rock Stage. In New York, Mr. Hudson appeared in "Merry Wives of Windsor," and has appeared with George Segal and Rosemary Murphy in "Major Barbara." On television he has appeared in "Robert Browning: Dramatic Monologues." Walter Williamson has worked at the Virginia Museum Theatre in "Marat/Sade," "Arms and the Man," and many other shows.

Tom Campbell, former Vagabond who worked with Otto Preminger on the filming of "Tell Me That You Love Me, Junie Moon," portrays Mr.

Onyx, chief of the international criminals. Earl Wentz has the role of Noel Forder, one of the crooks. This marks Mr. Wentz's second season at Flat Rock, where last year he performed in the World Premiere of "Crocodile Smile" and "Miss Pell is Missing," among others. In Charlotte, Mr. Wentz has his own studios of the Performing Arts.

Also in the cast is Helen Bragdon as the Irish housekeeper, Mrs. Maurya Goona. Miss Bragdon is best remembered for her portrayals of Opal in "Everybody Loves Opal," the mother in "Barefoot in the Park," and Eliza Gant in last season's "Look Homeward, Angel."

Sally Nall as Sandra Ord, the beautiful young daughter of the man with expensive tastes; Robin Farquhar as John Hastings, her lover; Celva Evans as Yrena, the hot-blooded Italian maiden; Deryl Carroll as Spike Munch, the rough East End bruiser; and Ralph Redpath as Eddie, the American who helps to solve the mystery.

in a war that up to now we have been unable to win. Moreover, there is always a feeling that most classified documents came into being to fulfill a bureaucratic rather than a national need.

that matter as old as nations, but the real test is whether the practice serves or harms the country. The purpose of the Commission would be to examine the system of controlled information that has grown up for the most part since 1940 to see if it now comports with national needs. And, if not, how we ought to improve it. If Congress approves the bill to establish this Commission, and I hope it will, it will then be incumbent on the president, the Vice President and the Speaker of the House, who have the power to appoint the Commissioners, to see that those they choose are uniquely qualified to serve the national interest rather than partisan political concerns.
