There will be a demonstration of weaving at the Sherwood Forest Craft Shop on Saturday afternoon, July 10th, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m.

Mrs. Hazel Roberts, a resident of Sherwood Forest and a member of its workshop, will work on a small portable loom.

Formerly of Captiva, Florida, and St. Louis, Missouri, Mrs. Roberts has done a great deal of indigenous weaving in Florida. The products of her looms are on display and for sale in the Sherwood Craft Shop, as are her attractive articles of macrame, which is so popular

just now. This talented craft invited the public to visit the Craft Shop on Saturday afternoon for this interesting demonstration. Sherwood Forest is just 8 1/2 miles south of Brevard on Highway 276, and a colorful sign at the entrance points the way to the Craft Shop.

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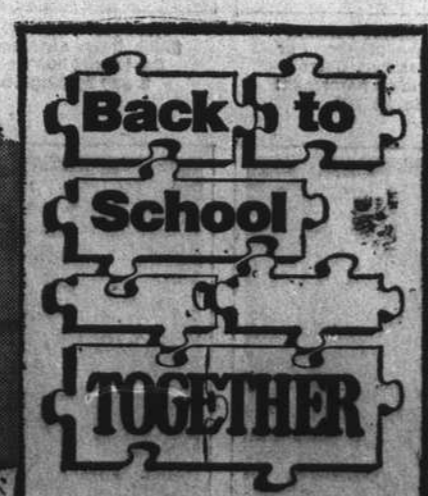
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
