

# Brevard Is The Site For Music Federation Weekend, July 16-18

## Delegates From 14 States Will Be Attending

Transylvania Music Camp will be the vacation spot most popular in North Carolina the weekend of July 16-18th; at that time Music Federation members from the 14-state Southeastern Region of the National Federation of Music Clubs gather for this traditional summer meeting of the Region, whose vice-president is Mrs. Jack Ward of Greenville. State Federations rotate the hostship and this year, the Alabama Federation of Music Clubs, Mrs. L. W. Kranert, President is hostess.

The National Federation will be represented by Mrs. Frank Vought, National First Vice-President, of Baton Rouge, La.

Mrs. Leah N. Settlemier, NCFMC President, heads the North Carolina delegation, expected to be the largest present. State officers, Board members and club members enjoy the operas (two are planned for Friday night, the 16th: Pagineci by Leoneavello and Unicorn in the Garden by Russell Smith); the concerts (the Transylvania Orchestra, Emil Raab, conductor, will be heard Saturday night, with Cellist Martha Gerschefski as soloist; and Sunday's Concert is by the Brevard Music Center orchestra, Henry Janiec, conducting and Pianist Lee Lavisi, soloist); and the delightful camp atmosphere (Transylvania is the oldest music camp in the area) and mountain beauty and temperature.

Saturday features a business session, with a panel of national and regional chairmen,

moderated by Mrs. Ward. The weekend opens with a tea in the Hinda Honigman Library at 4 p.m. Friday. Brevard College is opening one of its dormitories

to accommodate delegates.

The National Federation supports many music camps across the United States and the idea of holding a week-

end for regional business and fellowship is some 20 years old. Among the oldest of these is the weekend at Chataqua in North Carolina and Inspiration

Point Weekend in Arkansas. Scholarship students sent to the camp by the State Federations are always heard along with some sent by local clubs.

The Transylvania Scholarship winner from North Carolina this year is cellist Saxon Scarborough of Raleigh. The Georgia Federation usually

sends six or seven and almost all the 14 states in the region have representatives in camp, holding full or partial scholarships.
