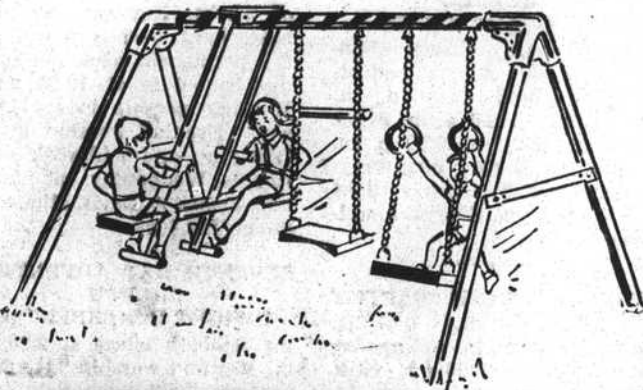
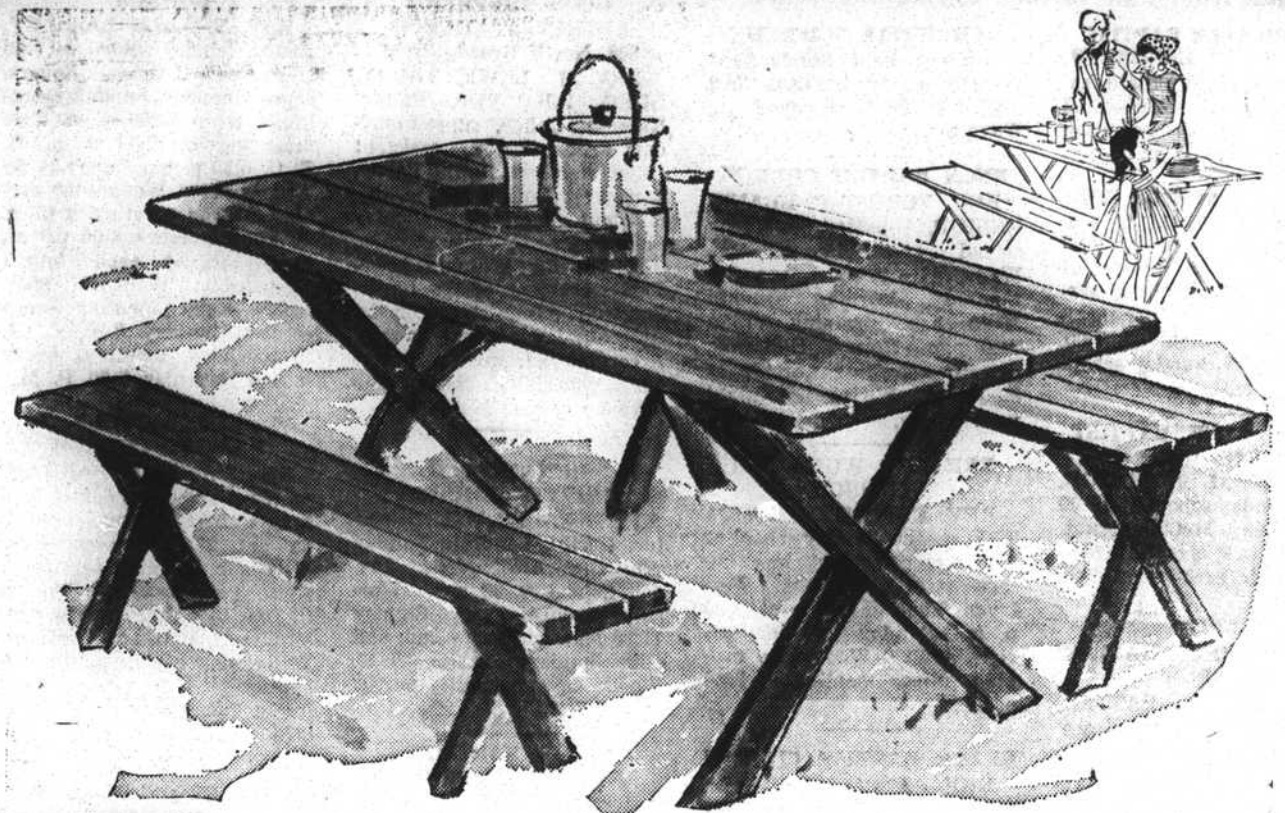
taken by the 1971 General Assembly relating to real estate and recent legal decisions affecting Realtors.
