A Seabee Reserve Unit is being organized in Asheville. The Naval Reserve Training Center is contacting local Seabee veterans to organize a drilling Construction Battalion as a unit of the Asheville Naval Reserve.

Seabees (an acronym for CB - Construction Battalions) were Naval Units organized during World War II to construct advance bases, ports and airfields in remote areas to support our overseas forces. Seabee units have since seen extensive combat action in Korea and Vietnam.

Bond Sales Reported Up

Series E & H sales of U. S. Savings Bonds in North Carolina for June amounted to \$5,723,114, an increase of 18.3 percent over sales for June of last year.

Cumulative sales for January-June amount to \$37,412,941, a 12.9 percent increase over the comparable period last year. This represents 58.8 percent of the state's 1971 dollar goal of \$63,600,000 and is the highest volume sold for any January-June period since 1945.

Sales in Transylvania County during June were \$32,062.00. January-June sales totaled \$163,745.00. This represents 58.1 percent of the county's goal of \$281,748.00, according to Jerry Jerome, County Volunteer Chairman.

The number of children with mothers in the labor force increased sharply in the last decade. The mothers of nearly 26 million children under 18 years old were in the labor force in March 1970. Almost 6 million of the children were under 6, that is, below school age and requiring some kind of care in their mother's absence.

Questions And Answers

Q. When my children graduated from high school, I went back to work. I plan to retire at 62. My husband will be 66 then. Will I get retirement benefits based on my husband's work record or my own?

A. You may be eligible for reduced monthly retirement benefits on your own record, as well as your husband's. However, you can't collect both benefits but you'll always receive the higher of the two amounts.

Q. How old does a disabled worker have to be to receive Social Security monthly disability benefits?

A. There is no minimum age, but a minimum work period under Social Security is required to be eligible for disability benefits. If a person becomes disabled before 24, he needs credit for 1½ years of working during the 3 years just before his disability began. If his disability starts between 24 and 31, needs work credits for half the time after 21 and before he became disabled. If a worker becomes disabled after 31, he needs credits

for at least 5 years of work in the 10 years before the start of the disability.

Q. I've been carrying my own health insurance for years. Since I'm getting close to 65, I was wondering if I should keep my own private insurance or enroll in Medicare. Can you help me decide?

A. Check with your insurance company before you reach 65. Most private insurance companies adjust their coverage at 65 so that it pays only for items not covered by Medicare. Don't delay, because you'd have to enroll before the month of your 65th birthday to get full Medicare protection as soon as you are 65 years old.

Q. I recently sent a post card form to check on my earnings under Social Security. When I received a statement of my earnings, I found that there was an error for the year 1969. How do I go about getting it corrected?

A. You should gather up any information you may have about your 1969 wages (payroll slips, withholding statements, etc.) and call or visit any Social Security office. There are people there who will help you straighten out your earnings record.
