## College Public Relations Director Eversman To Give Benefit Concert

John D. Eversman, well-known violinist, Public Relations Director of Brevard College and member of the music faculty there, will be heard in a benefit recital. The recital will be held at the Parish House of St. John in the Wilderness Episcopal Church, Flat Rock, on Tuesday, August 17, 1971 at 8:15 p. m. Miss Georgia Henson, also a member of the Brevard College music faculty, will be his accompanist.

The Ladies Aid Society is a community organization which maintains a clothes closet and a hospital supply loan closet for the benefit of needy persons in the Flat Rock area.

Mr. Eversman, an accomplished violinist, is an honor graduate of the Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music. He is well known in this area having been concert master of the Asheville Symphony Orchestra; faculty member at Asheville School for Boys; Music and Recreational Director at Ecusta Paper Corporation; organizer of the Brevard High School

Band and its director for twenty-seven years.

Governor Cherry appointed Mr. Eversman a member of the North Carolina Recreational Advisory Commission in 1947. He served as a member of the Board of Trustees of the National Industrial Recreation Association for six years. He has served as president of the Brevard Music Festival, and during 1952-54, he was the public relations director of Brevard College.

In addition to his present position at Brevard College, Mr. Eversman is president of the Board of Trustees, Vagabond School of the Drama and Flat Rock Playhouse; and Public Relations Consultant and Representative of the Brevard Music Center.

Miss Henson, pianist who will appear with Eversman, has been choral director and associate band director at Brevard High School during the past three years. She is a graduate of Western Carolina University at Cullowhee and received her Master of Arts degree from Appalachian State University in Boone. Miss Henson has been named choir director and organist for the Church of St. John in the Wilderness and will assume her duties there on Sunday, August 22nd.

## Kearns Is With CP & L During Summer Months

Thomas Nelson Kearns of Brevard is among 110 students gaining first-hand experience in the electric power industry as a summer employee of Carolina Power & Light Company in Skyland.

Kearns is a rising junior at North Carolina State University.

CP&L has had a summer student employee program for approximately 50 years. J. S. Newbold, CP&L personnel director, said promising university, college and high school students are hired by the utility to help relieve regular employees for summer vacation.

The summer work also is a possible preliminary step toward fulltime employment after graduation. A number of present employees now in management positions were CP&L summer employees while attending area colleges and universities.

The majority of the students are from NCSU and other branches of the University of North Carolina. In addition, 34 other schools are represented by the student employees.
