Football camp at Brevard High School ended on a successful note last Saturday when fifteen of the Blue Devil squad members were presented awards for outstanding camp performances by members of the BHS coaching staff.

Two of the Blue Devils, Steve Morgan and Denny Griffin, were double award winners and each received two trophies. Offensive guard Morgan was named the best offensive lineman in camp, and also received the outstanding leadership trophy. Denny Griffin was named the best offensive back in camp, and was also named most valuable in camp.

The "Rat" of the year award, going to a first year camper, went to Carroll Owen, while best rookie honors were shared by Dennis Clark and Danny Walker.

Two Blue Devils, Wayne Robinson and Darius Holtzclaw, shared best receiver honors, while Dwight Hooper was named most improved player in camp.

Tom Shipman was named best defensive lineman, while Mitch Burr was awarded the best linebacker trophy. Mitch Dockens won the best defensive back award, and David Whitesides was named the squad's most improved hitter.

Ben Brown won the award for having the most team spirit on the field, and awards of a humorous nature went to Marco White and Carl Conley.

The awards were presented Saturday afternoon in the BHS auditorium, and then ten-day camp officially closed at 2:30 p.m.

Coach Ed Emory commended the players on their fine football camp and stated that they had shown much progress and improvement during the ten-day session.

Now that school is open, the Blue Devils are undergoing one practice session daily in preparation for their opener against rugged T. C. Roberson on Friday, September 3rd.

Brevard Looks Rugged In Scrimmage With Strong South Carolina Team

Coach Ed Emory's Brevard Blue Devils gave every indication of being ready for the start of the 1971 grid season last Friday night in a rugged scrimmage session with strong Brookland Cayce of Columbia, S. C.

was completed for one of B-C's two touchdowns of the evening. The other came on an intercepted pass that was run back for a score from about 30 yards out.

Brevard scored three touchdowns during the scrimmage, compiling almost 500 yards rushing and passing. Jacob Norman ran the first one on a 70 yard sprint, and almost broke another long scoring jaunt a few minutes later.

Playing under rules that permitted no kickoffs or punts and which allowed each team to start at its own twenty yard line and run ten offensive plays before relinquishing the ball to the opposition at their twenty, the Blue Devils and their Palmetto State visitors put on quite a show for the 1,000 plus fans in attendance.

The Blue Devils displayed an awesome defensive alignment that at times simply overwhelmed their opponents' vaunted single-wing attack. Defensive linemen Tom Shipman, Ben Brown, Van Zeigler, Jerry Powell, and David Whitesides were simply outstanding in leading this onslaught.

Brookland Cayce was held to approximately 150 yards total offense in the two hour scrimmage, and 75 of these came on a little jump pass over center that

Denny Griffin passed to Wayne Robinson for another long touchdown play that covered some 60 yards, and sophomore tailback Danny Walker looked fine in running over the third touchdown from about 35 yards out.

Coach Ed Emory stated that he and his staff were pleased with many aspects of the scrimmage, particularly Brevard's defensive effort. "We still have many kinks to iron out before our opener with T. C. Roberson on September 3rd, however, and we're going to have to come up with a real fine effort to beat them," he said.

Tigers Entertain Tryon In Grid Opener At Rosman This Friday Night

The Bengals will meet this Friday night when the Rosman Tigers host the Tryon Tigers in the season opening football game for both schools.

Coach Lee Powell has been sending his charges through rugged practice sessions in order to have them ready for this tough opener, and he feels that they are ready.

"Tryon, as always, will field a strong team," he stated, "But they can be whipped if

we come up with a good effort. I really think our boys will be ready for them Friday night, and I hope a good crowd will be on hand to see what should be a real fine game," he concluded.

Rosman has good personnel returning, and if injuries don't thin the ranks too much, this should be one of the Tigers' better teams in recent years.

One of the truly bright spots is quarterback Jimmy

Hall, who will be directing the team for his third consecutive year. The versatile signal-caller is always a threat every time he handles the ball. If Tryon is going to win, they must contain Hall.

Tryon finished 8-2 last year, while Rosman finished with a conference winning 6-3 mark.

A large crowd is expected for the season opener at Rosman. The kick-off has been set for 8:00 p.m.
