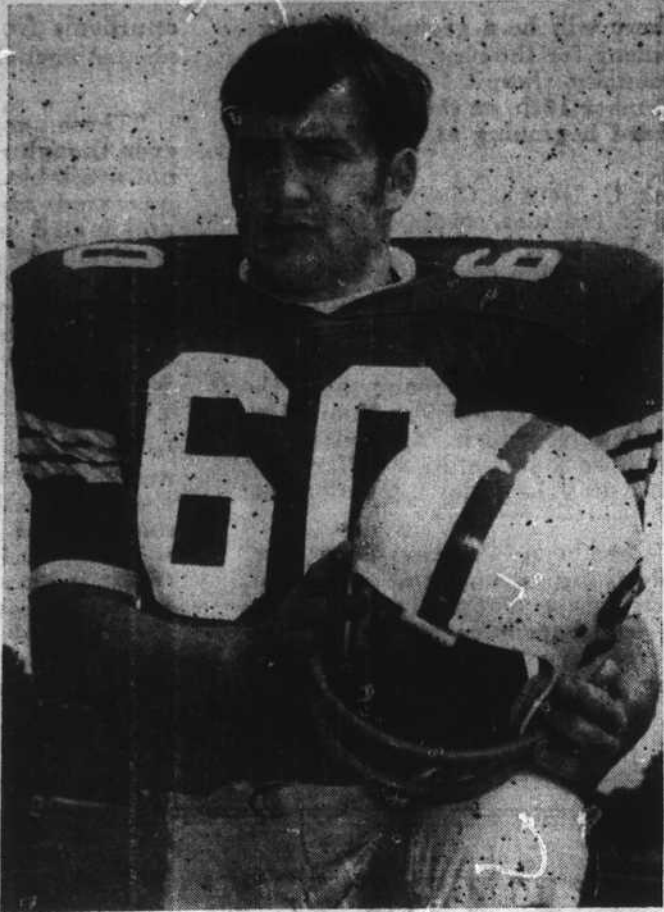


Brevard's Great First Half Effort Blitzes T. C. Roberson 49-25

Blue Devils Lead 42-7 At Halftime



Brevard's blitzing Blue Devils overcame a host of fumbles and penalties to whip a game but outmanned T.C. Roberson football squad 45-19 in the season opener for both schools last Friday night.

The Blue Devils bobbled the opening kickoff, held the Rams in check on their first series, and then scored on their second offensive play of the night on a brilliant 86-yard sideline sprint by Jacob Norman.

Stan Hudson kicked the first of his seven extra points, sending Brevard into a 7-0 lead with 8:25 remaining in the first quarter.

The "Big Blue Machine" then unleashed all of its offensive power, scoring the next five times that it had ball possession in the first half. The Denny Griffin led Blue Devils scored twice more in the first period and three times in the second frame to lead 42-7 at halftime.

After Jacob Norman's long scoring jaunt, the speedy youngster then scored Brevard's second touchdown on a two-yard run that climaxed a 60-yard drive. Big gainers in —Turn To Page Three

Blue Devils Face Tough Tuscola In Conference Clash Here Friday

"We'll have to play better than we did in the last half against T. C. Roberson, or Tuscola will blow us right off the field," stated Coach Ed Emory about his Blue Devils' important clash here this Friday night against the Tuscola Mountaineers.

"Tuscola has a good, solid ball club, and on top of that, their quarterback and one of their starting halfbacks live with Coach Joe Caldwell, and they certainly know his system," the Blue Devil bossman stated.

He was referring to Jody Caldwell, Tuscola's fine passing quarterback, and his hard-running brother Jeff, who are

both Coach Caldwell's sons. "It's too bad that a game as early in the season as this one has such importance," Coach Emory continued. Most area football observers generally concede that Tuscola and Brevard are the two strongest teams in the Parkway Division of the AAA Mountain Conference, and thus the entire season, as far as a playoff spot is concerned, could be wrapped up in Friday night's game here.

Coach Emory then went on to say that his past Monday's practice session was the best to date for the Blue Devils, and he is confident that his squad realizes the importance

of Friday night's encounter with the strong Mounties.

"We're going to do our best to be ready for them, and I feel that if we can contain Jody Caldwell's passing, we'll be in pretty good shape," he concluded.

The Rosman Tigers scored three first half touchdowns and then coasted the rest of the way to a big 18-0 win over East Yancey at Rosman last Thursday night.

The loss was the first for East Yancey, who had defeated Hot Springs in their opener the previous week. The Tigers' record is now 1-1 after an opening game loss to Tryon.

Quarterback Jimmy Hall put Rosman on the score board first in the opening quarter when he sprinted around right end for fourteen yards and six points.

The score climaxed a 50-yard drive that was spearheaded by a 23-yard run by halfback Jimmy Earl McCall. A beautifully executed two point conversion pass play from Jimmy Hall to Tim Thorpe was nullified when the Tigers were detected offside. The next attempt failed, but Rosman led 6-0.

Rosman scored next on a four-yard plunge up the middle by Tony Gantt, and again a few minutes later on a one-yard run by Weldon Whitmire. Both conversion attempts failed, and the scoring for the first half, and the entire game, was over, with Rosman winning 18-0.

Coach Lee Powell's Tigers completely dominated the statistics, outrushing East Yancey by 222 yards to 90 and outpassing them 50 yards to four.

Rosman's defensive unit, spearheaded by tackle Ricky Lee and safety Tim Thorpe, was particularly outstanding, in holding East Yancey's fine quarterback, Jim Norris, in check for most of the evening.

The Tigers will be seeking their second win of the season this Thursday night when they host Asheville High's "B" team in a game scheduled to get underway at 8:00 p.m.
