Soil Tests

Now is a good time to get soil samples from fields to be planted next year. Also this aplies for lawns and home gar-dens. Samples submitted now will be returned in time for growers to make necessary lime applications when land is prepared for cover crops.

Fall application of lime allows for neutralization of soil acidity and removal of aluminum which reacts to phosphorus and reduces its efficienty. Therefore, lime applied as soon as possible will result in more efficient utilization of phosphorus applied next spring.


