The Blue Devils scored once more with 53 seconds remaining in the first half when Jacob Norman got his third touch-down of the night on a 26 yard run. The Griffin-to-Salter pass combination clicked for the two point conversion once more, and Brevard went in at half-time leading 36-7.

The assault continued in the last half as Danny Walker went over from the 10 yard line early in the third period, with Stan Hudson giving Brevard a 42-7 advantage with his perfect conversion.

Terry Crite then appeared on the scene for the first time this season after recovering from a pre-season fractured wrist, and he made his debut in awesome
