Pisgah Jayvees Whip Brevard "A" Team 28-14 In Squeaker

The undefeated Pisgah High Jayvees edged the Brevard High "A" Team by a 28-14 score at Canton last Thursday night, but the margin of victory was not as wide as the score might indicate.

The young Blue Devils were trailing by only six points with just under five minutes of play remaining in the game when they tried an onside kick in an effort to regain ball possession after William Lynch's touchdown narrowed the margin to 20-14, Pisgah.

The alert Pisgah defenders recovered the short kick, however, and started a drive that ended with another Pisgah score coming with only 15 seconds showing on the clock.

Brevard took the lead in the hard fought contest in the first period when quarterback Dale Griffin passed to Jimmy Phillips for a touchdown. The score had been set up when Brevard recovered a Pisgah fumble at the Pisgah 21. Gary Wynn kicked the extra point

giving Brevard a 7-0 lead. Pisgah countered with a score early in the second period when Chuck Stines scored but the failure of a two point conversion attempt still left Brevard ahead 7-6.

Ronnie West scored for Pisgah late in the second quarter and Stines took it over for a two point conversion giving the homestanding young Bears a 14-6 halftime advantage.

After a scoreless third period, West scored his second six pointer in the final frame. The extra point attempt was blocked, leaving Pisgah ahead 20-7.

Brevard took advantage of another Pisgah fumble to set up the final score for the visitors, which really brought the crowd to its feet. William Lynch fumbled three times on the same play, but he finally got ball possession enough to carry it on over for the score. Wynn kicked the extra point, setting the stage for the onside kick-off attempt that failed.

Undeclared Bearcats, Blue Devils To Clash Here This Friday Night

Two long-time gridiron foes, the Brevard Blue Devils and the Hendersonville Bearcats, will meet for the umpteenth time in their long history here Friday night, and, as has been the case many times in the past, both teams are undefeated.

Coach Joe Hunt's strong Bearcats, moving up into AAA competition this year after completely dominating AA grid circles for the past several years, are reportedly strong and versatile once again this year.

The undefeated Bearcats have only given up twelve points to four opponents so far, and even Brevard's potent offense is expected to experience trouble moving against the stalwart Hendersonville defense.

"Joe Hunt always does a great job with the single-wing, and we can't expect anything less than a good Hendersonville team to come over here Friday night," Coach Ed Emory commented.

Hendersonville has chalked up wins over Edneyville, Reynolds, Owen and East Henderson to date, and they will be going all out to keep their record unblemished against the Blue Devils.

Coach Emory also noted that only three blemishes appear on Hendersonville's record since 1968, and two of those, a 19-19 tie in 1968 and a narrow 27-26 loss last year, were administered by the Blue Devils. "They're

bound to be chompin' at the bit to get back at us for that one point win last year," Coach Emory stated, "And I just hope we'll be mentally prepared for them."

It's an old, old rivalry, and Friday night's meeting be-

tween the two should be another in a long line of thrillers.

Kickoff has been set for 8:00 p.m., and perhaps the largest crowd of the year is expected to be on hand when the opening whistle sounds.

Norman, Crite Score 3 TD's Each In Rout

Brevard's devastating Blue Devils got three touchdown performances by Jacob Norman and Terry Crite, added two more by Danny Walker, and one each by Denny Griffin and Randy Moretz to shoot down North Buncombe's Blackhaws by a 70-7 margin here last Friday night.

Even a terribly muddy field caused by unexpected late afternoon rains Friday couldn't slow down the Blue Devils, who chalked up their fourth consecutive win in as many games this young season.

Jacob Norman, continuing his personal assault on Brevard High's record books, set the pace early when he sprinted 60 yards for a touchdown on Brevard's first offensive play to send the Blue Devils ahead 6-0. Stan Hudson's kick made it 7-0 with only eleven seconds gone in the game. Norman has now carried 40 times this season for a 15.1 average.

North Buncombe, the last team to hand the Blue Devils a regular season defeat on their own field, showed signs of life by taking the kickoff and marching 60 yards for their only score of the evening. Ernie Lasher bulled his way over from the one to score and then kicked the extra point that tied it up at seven all with 8:37 remaining in the first period.

Then, for all practical purposes, school was out for the Hawks.

The Blue Devils received, and in four plays they were on the scoreboard again, with Norman sweeping wide for 17 yards and the score. Hudson's kick raised

the count to 14-7, Brevard, with 5 minutes left in the first quarter.

On the next series of downs, North Buncombe stiffened its defense enough to halt the surging Blue Devils for one of only several times during the evening.

But the "Big Blue Machine" was back in operation early in the second period as Danny Walker went 28 yards for another Brevard six pointer. Denny Griffin bobbled the snap from center on the extra point attempt, and was stopped short trying to run, leaving the score 20-7, Brevard.

North Buncombe fumbled at their own 37 yard line several plays later, Brevard recovered, and Denny Griffin had Brevard on the scoreboard again four plays later as he went over from the two. The versatile Blue Devil signal-caller then passed to Ricky Salter for the two point conversion, putting Brevard ahead 28-7.

The Blue Devils scored once more with 53 seconds remaining in the first half when Jacob Norman got his third touchdown of the night on a 26 yard run. The Griffin-to-Salter pass combination clicked for the two point conversion once more, and Brevard went in at halftime leading 36-7.

The assault continued in the last half as Danny Walker went over from the 10 yard line early in the third period, with Stan Hudson giving Brevard a 42-7 advantage with his perfect conversion.

Terry Crite then appeared on the scene for the first time this season after recovering from a pre-season fractured wrist, and he made his debut in awesome style.

The hard-running senior scored Brevard's next three touchdowns on runs of five, five and sixteen yards. Hudson kicked true after one score, had his kick blocked after another, and then Rob-

ert Charles passed to Keith Nicholson for a two pointer that raised the score to 64-7 with still over seven minutes left to play.

Randy Moretz concluded the scoring onslaught with a five yard jaunt with 1:38 to play, and when Robert Charles was stopped short on the two-point conversion attempt, the Blue Devils had themselves a 70-7 victory.

The margin of victory was not the largest ever for Brevard, as some observers might think. That record was set by Doyce Cannon's 1966 Blue Devils who shut-out the Franklin Panthers here by a 71-0 score.

Tigers Trip Christ School 12-6 In Thriller, Travel To Hot Springs

The Rosman Tigers rode a brilliant pass interception and run back by Tim Thorpe to a big 12-6 win over the Christ School Greenies at Rosman last Saturday night, marking the first win for Rosman over the Greenies since 1964.

The win was a real thriller for the large Homecoming crowd and brought Rosman's overall record to a fine 4-1 mark.

Christ School quarterback Peter Ingle put his team on the scoreboard first in the initial period of the game

when he passed 32 yards to Alex Bethune. Dan Stevenson ran for the two point conversion that gave the Greenies a 8-0 lead.

The Tigers came back in the second period and drove 80 yards for their first score, which came on a nineteen yard sprint by Jimmy Earl McCall. Two important plays in this drive were passes from Jimmy Hall to Ralph Johnson for 12 and 28 yards respectively. The extra point attempt failed and Rosman trailed by two at halftime, 8-6.

After a scoreless third period,

Christ School started a drive that carried deep into Rosman territory. With the Greenies threatening to pad their two point advantage, Ingle fired a pass that was right on target for his intended receiver.

It was right then that Tim Thorpe timed his move perfectly and stepped right in front of the receiver at Rosman's 18 yard line, intercepted the pass, picked up beautiful downfield blocking, reversed his field and sped 78 yards for the score and the Rosman victory.

The extra point attempt failed, but it really didn't matter as the Tigers chalked up their fourth win of the year 12-6 over Christ School.

"It was the finest all around effort that I have seen a Tiger team come up with in recent years," Coach Lee Powell remarked about the big win.

"Every team member played well, and they all deserve a great deal of credit for the excellent job that they did. I'm just as proud as I can be

of all of them," he concluded.

In commenting on Rosman's upcoming Appalachian Conference game with Hot Springs there this Friday night, Coach Powell said that he didn't expect his Tigers to have it too easy.

"They've lost several real close games to some pretty good teams, and I expect they'll give us a real fine ball game," he stated.

Kickoff time at Hot Springs Friday night has been set for 8:00 p.m.
