Following the presentation, everyone was invited to the Fellowship Hall for refreshments and to view the girls displays.

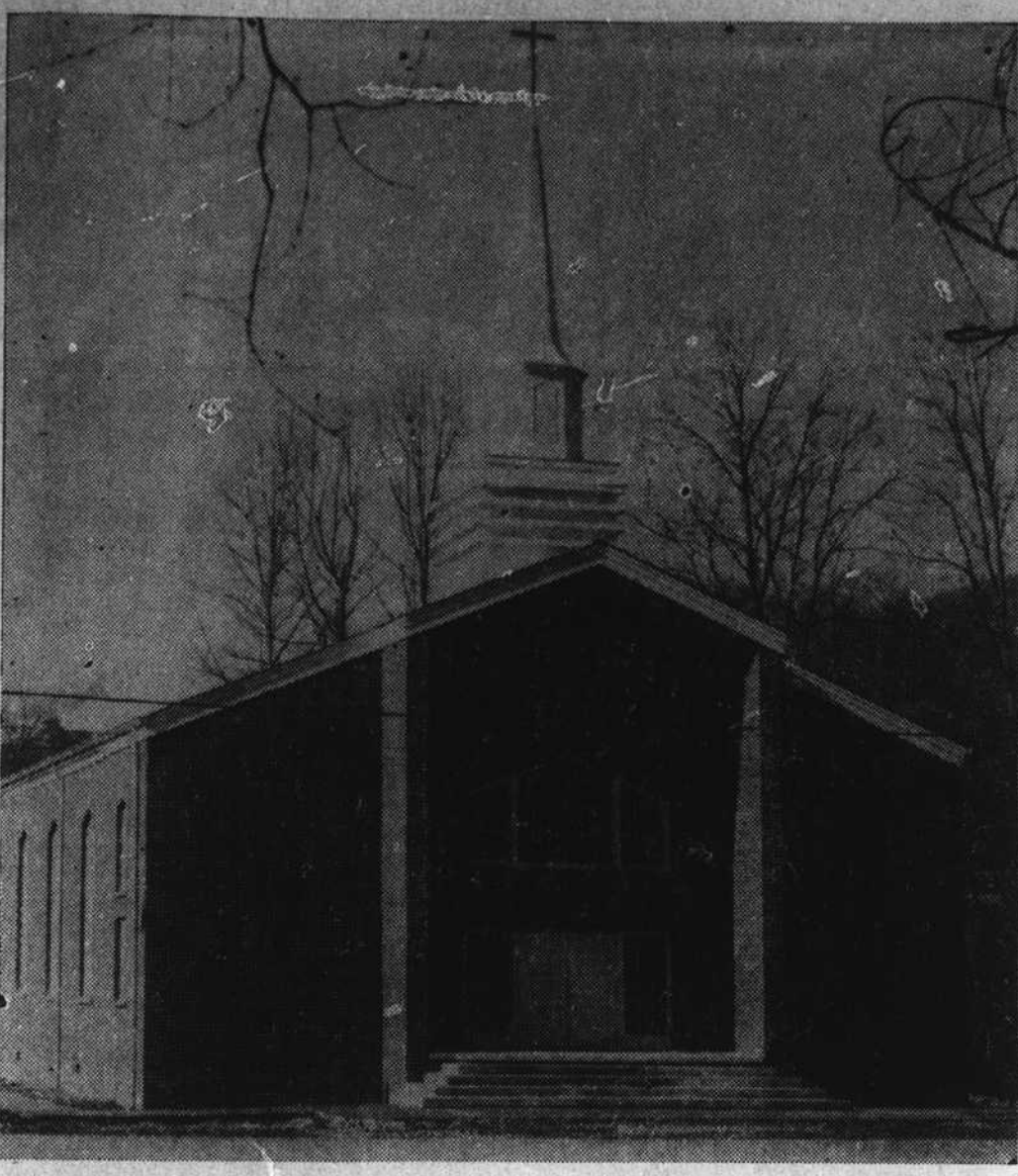
Thirty six boys and leaders of the RA's and Boy Scout troop 700 went on a trip to Marion last week.
