Too often the public tries to create much more mystery in a work of art than is really there. They need to understand that the artist is trying to eliminate complexities in order to reach a simple way of expressing himself.

In some cases this may mean that the only aesthetic response can be from the artist himself, but gradually the public is beginning to grasp the concepts of the artist and appreciate his dealings with perceptive values well as with social values.

SNEA Represents B.C. At U.N.C.-A.


On Tuesday, October 5, four students and Mr. Tawney at-


