First Period Blitz Subdues Green Wave

The alert Brevard Blue Devils took advantage of several early Glen Alpine mistakes and combined them with a brilliant opening game sustained drive to win a 35-7 decision over the Green Wave here last Friday night.

The Blue Devils, preparing for their all important conference championship showdown game with the Enka Jets this Friday night, struck like lightning to move ahead quickly in their non-conference clash with Glen Alpine.

So devastating was their attack that they were ahead 21-0 at the end of the first period, and the eventual outcome of the game was never in doubt after that.

Taking the opening kickoff, Brevard moved steadily goalward from there, taking only nine plays to drive 63 yards for the score. Quarterback Robert Charles swept wide left on a keeper and sprinted the final 16 yards for the touchdown. Stan Hudson kicked the first of his five extra points to give Brevard a 7-0 lead with 7:15 remaining in the first quarter.

Glen Alpine ran the kickoff back to their 27 and ran

three plays before Columbus Carpenter fumbled and Brevard recovered on the Green Wave 20.

It took only five plays for the "Big Blue Machine" to be on the scoreboard again, with big Mitch Burr blasting the final five yards for the six pointer. Hudson kicked true and it was 14-0 with 2:38 left in the period.

Once again Brevard kicked off, and once again the opportunistic Blue Devils were ready, with James McKinney recovering another Green Wave fumble at the Glen Alpine 38.

Terry Crite gained 16 to the 22, Jacob Norman added five to the 17, Brevard was penalized five back to the 22, and then Robert Charles spotted Ronnie Banther all alone in the end zone and fired a perfect strike to him good for Brevard's third touchdown of the first period. Hudson's kick made it 21-0.

The shell-shocked Green Wave still couldn't gather any momentum, and was forced to punt from deep in G.A. territory. The on-charging Blue Devils blocked the punt and recovered at Glen Alpine's three.

Burr bulled his way to the one, and then Robert Charles sneaked the final yard for his second score of the night, and when Hudson kicked his fourth extra point, Brevard led 28-0 with 10:14 remaining in the second quarter.

The Blue Devils continued to dominate the action, but Coach Jug Wilson's defense stiffened enough to keep Brevard from scoring again until the final period.

Glen Alpine's offense finally got a drive underway, their only one of the night, that got them on the scoreboard in the final period.

The drive was a fine one, starting at the G.A. 19 and ending 14 plays and a fifteen yard Brevard penalty later with quarterback Raymond Scott passing the final 6 yards to Columbus Carpenter for the touchdown. Freddie Bowers kicked the extra point that made the score 28-7, Brevard, with only 2:03 remaining in the game.

The Blue Devils still weren't through, however, and utilized the last two minutes to negotiate 60 yards in seven plays for their final touchdown.

It came as time ran out with Robert Charles passing to flanker Wayne Robinson for 28 yards and the score, and when Stan Hudson split the uprights the final score had been reached with Brevard winning 35-7.

Blue Devils, Jets To Decide Parkway Championship Friday

Brevard High's entire football season will be wrapped up into one game, and that game will be played this Friday night at Enka stadium when the Blue Devils and the Jets meet to decide the Parkway Division championship.

The Jets, under a new head coach this year, have undoubtedly been the major surprise of the grid campaign here in WNC as they marched undefeated through their first eight games before falling to non-conference foe Hendersonville by a 61-20 margin last Friday night. Now, both Brevard and Enka have identical 8-1 records.

"Actually the score of that game is deceiving," stated Brevard head coach Ed Emory, "Because the game was tied 20-20 going into the final quarter, and Enka had a

real shot at handing the Bearcats their third defeat of the season. But things started going wrong all of a sudden, and before you knew it Hendersonville had pulled the game out of reach. But Enka played a great game for three of the four periods. They'll be tough to handle back in conference competition and battling for the championship and a playoff spot, and we're going to have to play our very best game in order to beat them," Coach Emory concluded.

He then commented that he and the staff were most pleased with Brevard's showing in their past two games. He noted that his Blue Devils had allowed Erwin and Glen Alpine a combined 72 yards rushing and only 15 passing and one touchdown, while piling up

550 yards rushing and 169 passing, good for 81 points of their own.

"They're putting it all together now, and I just hope that they can continue to come up with the good effort against Enka in this one that is so important," he said. "We're in pretty good shape physically, and I feel like we'll really be ready for the Jets. I know that the spirit is good and the team wants this one badly. I think we'll be ready to play," he stated.

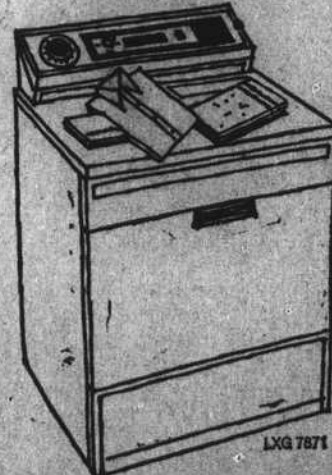
