Wash eggplant and parboil 10 minutes in boiling water to cover. Remove from water and cut a lengthwise slice from the top. Scrape out pulp to within ½ inch from the skin and from the slice removed from top. Chop finely. Saute garlic and onion in olive oil in large skillet. Remove garlic. Add ground beef and cook until it is no longer pink. Add egg-plant pulp, green pepper and parsley; cook 5 minutes. Re-move from heat and add seasonings. Sprinkle additional salt and black pepper inside the eggplant shell and fill with meat mixture. Mix bread crumbs with cheese and melted butter. Sprinkle over the top. Bake in a 350°F. oven 30 minutes or until crumbs are browned. Makes: 6 servings. G. W. is enthused too.
