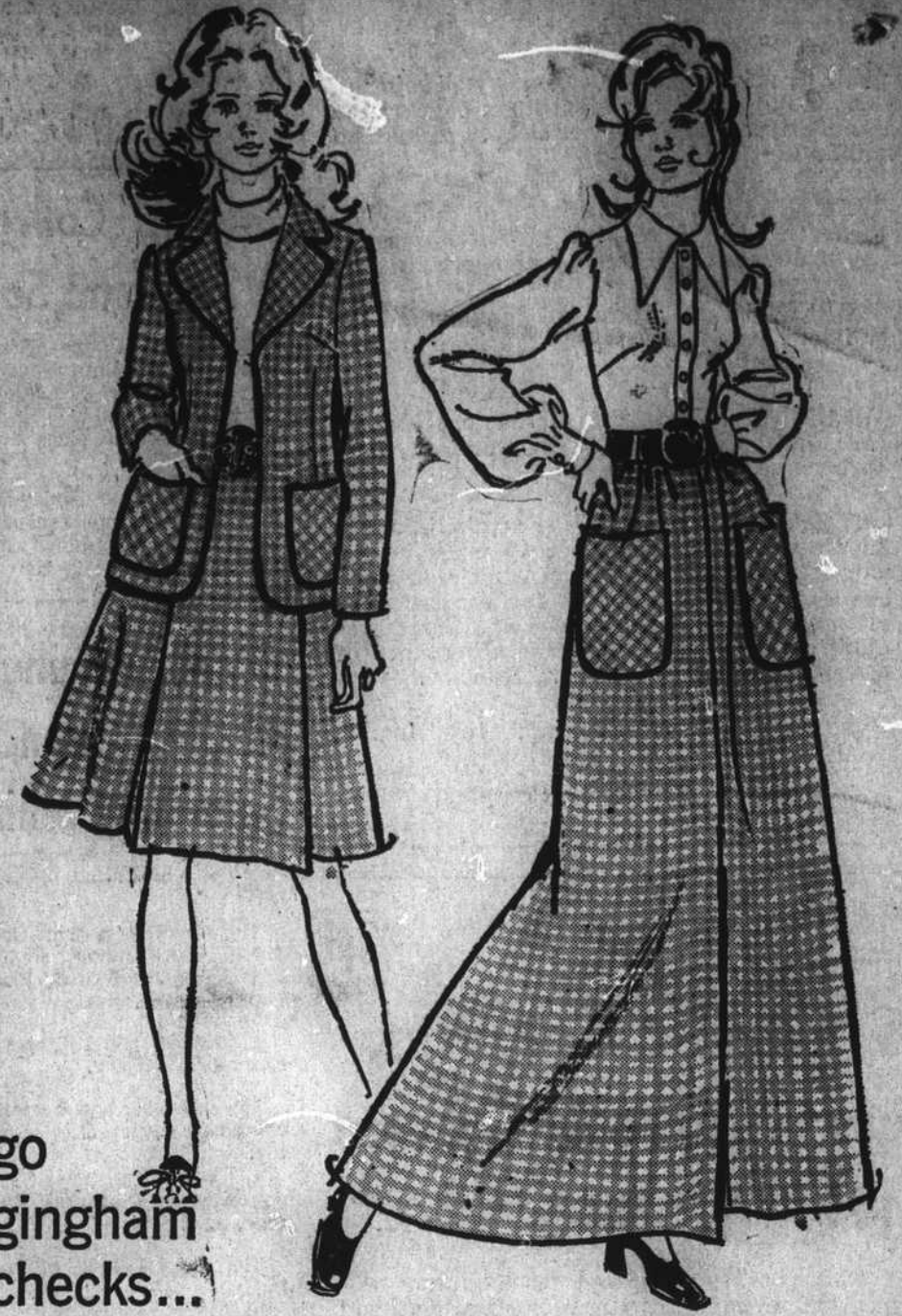

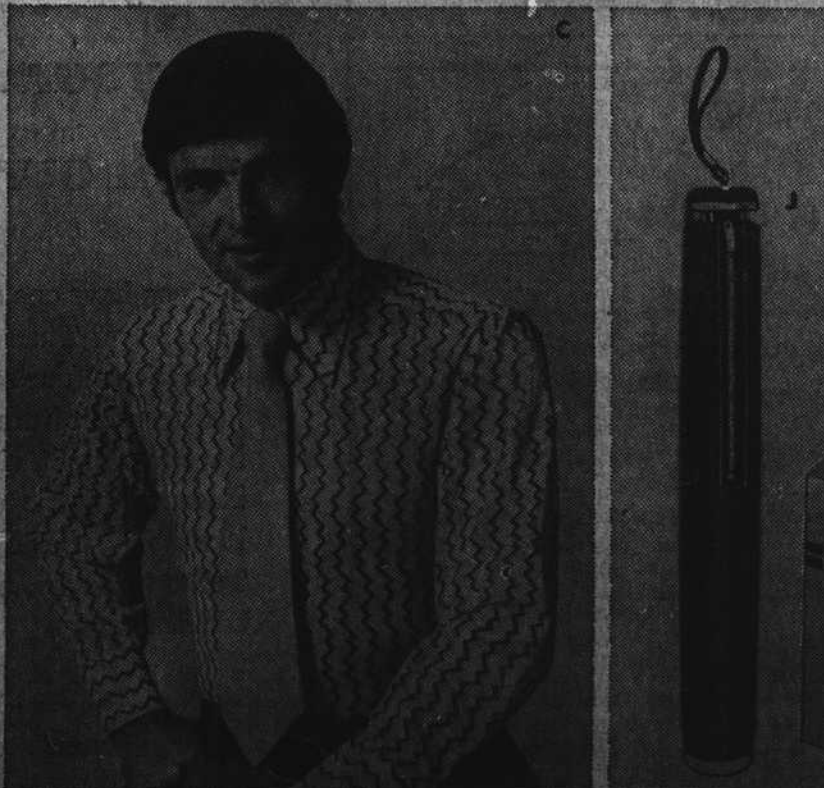
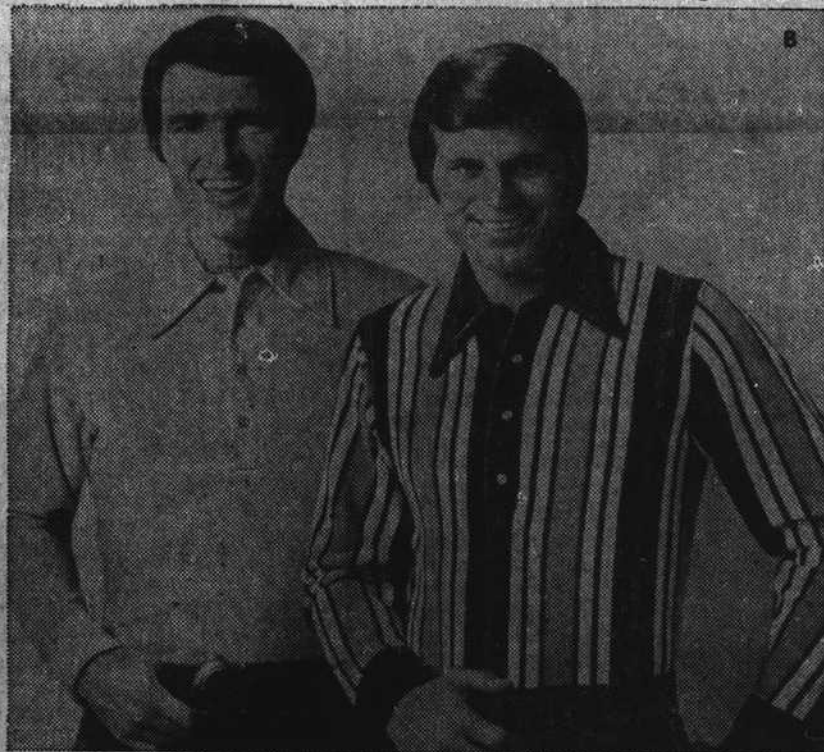

Family Dollar Stores Announces Record Sales And Earnings, 1970

Leon Levine, President of Family Dollar Stores, announces record sales and earnings for the fiscal year ended August 31, 1971. Sales were \$27,453,198, up from \$17,703,944 in the 1970 fiscal year, an increase of

\$9,749,254, or 55%. Net earnings rose approximately 56% to \$1,661,810 or 83c per common share on the 2,000,000 shares of common stock outstanding, compared with \$1,067,088 or 53c per share for the fiscal year 1970.

Mr. Levine also announced that the Company's expansion program is continuing at a rapid pace. A total of 26 stores were opened in this fiscal period resulting in 95 stores in operation at August 31, 1971. Since then, the Company has opened an additional 7 stores and now has 102 stores in operation.
