## Three Communities Represent To Transylvania At Awards Luncheon

Several hundred rural and civic leaders from the 18 Western North Carolina counties will be on hand at the Asheville City Auditorium at noon on Saturday, December 11th for the announcement of the winners of the Western North Carolina Community Development Program for 1971.

The occasion will be the annual awards luncheon of the Asheville Agricultural Development Council honoring the rural communities in the area that have made the greatest progress during the year.

Featured speaker at the affair will be Melvin Graham of Matthews, N. C., brother of famed evangelist Billy Graham, who was originally scheduled as the speaker. Melvin Graham, a Mecklen-burg County farmer and a recognized speaker in his own right, agreed to pinch-hit when Billy Graham cancelled to make an "important gov-ernment mission."

Over \$5,000 in awards will be presented to the organized community groups in the area that have made the most progress during the year. Winners in various counties were presented several thousand dollars in awards earlier this fall by local

Representing Transylvania county in contention for top area awards are SapphireWhitewater Division "A" (less than 75 families); Cedar Mountain in Division "B" (75-150 families; and Little River in Division "C" (over 150 families.) Cedar Mountain was the county representative in the final judging of the youth program.

The WNC Community Development Program is sponsored by the Asheville Agricultural Development Council and the agricultural agencies in each county. The awards meeting on December 11 will mark the completion of 22 years of operation of the Agricultural Development Council as an area development association for the western counties.


