Brevard Places Eleven On Parkway Division All-Conference Squad

Brevard's Blue Devils dominated the all-conference selections announced last week by the coaches of the Parkway Division of the Mountain AAA Conference.

Coach Ed Emory's team, edged out for the conference title by the Enka Jets in the last game of the season, placed eleven players on the honor squad, and most of them were unanimous selections.

Six Blue Devils were named to the offensive all-conference team, and these included Shrine Bowl bound Darius Holtzclaw, end; thousand yard plus gainer Jacob Norman, running back; Speedy Wayne Robinson, flanker, who was named in spite of being injured most of the year; Ronnie Whitmore, tackle; Steve Morgan, guard; and Denny Griffin, who was named to the honor squad at quarterback even though he missed the last half of the season with a shoulder separation.

On defense Brevard placed Tom Shipman at tackle, Ronnie Banther at end, Mitchell Burr at linebacker, and Dwight Hooper at defensive halfback.

Stan Hudson was named all-conference place kicker on the squad.

Griffin led the Brevard boys with 20 points, and Morris had 17.

Ricky McClure netted a three-point play with 50 seconds left in the game to give Brevard College an 87-84 lead and the Tornados went on to capture a 91-88 victory over Hiwassee College Monday night.

Leading Brevard to its third victory without a loss was George Hester with 24 points followed by McClure with 23, Bob Miller with 14 and Bill McClure with 10.

From a 46-46 tie at halftime Brevard took the lead and held it until Hiwassee tied the score at 71-71 with 5:29 left in the contest. This set the stage for McClure who hit clutch free throws and baskets in the closing minutes to spearhead the victory.

Program is designed to teach the intricate nature of modern internal combustion engines ranging from tractors to snowmobiles and lawnmowers. Emphasis is placed on the importance of safe operation and careful maintenance. This year some 125,000 boys and girls participated in the program.

Frank, 15, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde C. Summey and is one of three children. Active in many 4-H programs, he has participated six years in wildlife, electricity, crafts, and dairy calves.

His enthusiasm for the Petroleum Power Program is obvious from his five year participation in both small engines and tractor operation. He has 670 hours of tractor operation and was the state winner in the Petroleum Power Program long term records. He won the "I Dare You Award" in 1970. This year he won the district award in Tractor Driving, county champion in Tractor Driving, and was state finalist in 4-H Automotive Skill Driving Contest.

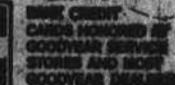
