We were saddened to learn of the death of Furman Parker, brother to Alvin Parker of Rosman highway. We extend sympathy to that family also.

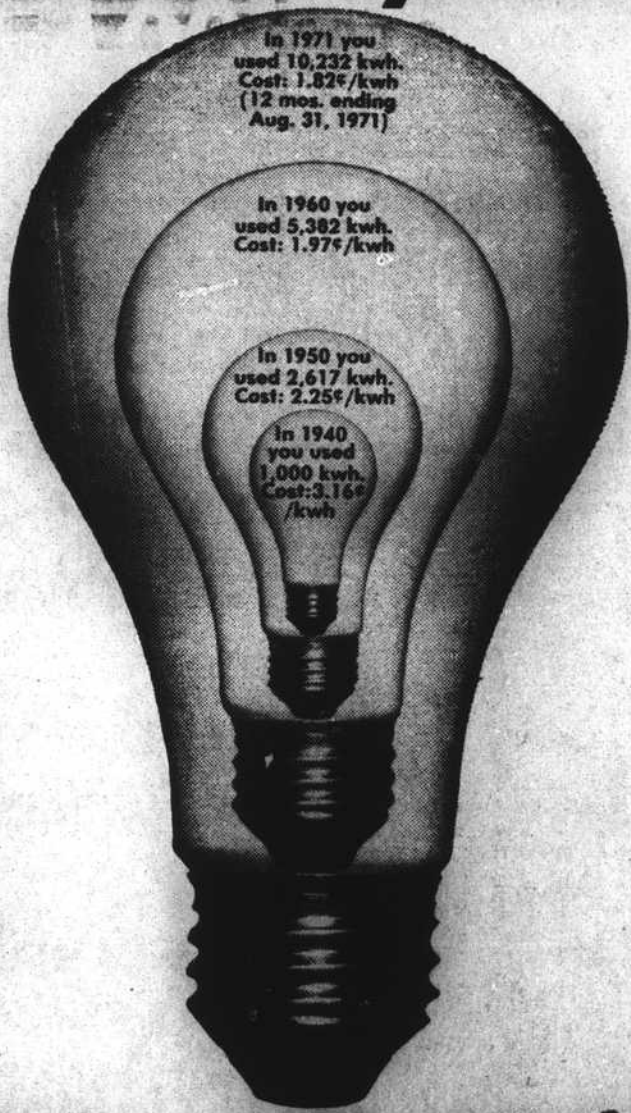
Mrs. Ella Vaughn and family of Greenville, S. C., have been visiting relatives here.
