The state will count its holiday highway toll from 6 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 23, through mid-night Sunday, December 26, for a period of 78 hours. In a similar span last year, the casualty count came to 31 killed (18 on Christmas Day) and 656 injured in 1,145 accidents.

Leading causes of accidents were speeding, driving left of center, failure to yield and driving under the influence.

"Our traffic deaths this year are running well ahead of 1970," said Thomas B. Watkins, president of the motor club and the National Automobile Association. "It will take a near miracle in the short time remaining to prevent an increase in highway fatalities for the first time in three years-but it can be


