
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Why are children's shoes so expensive?

The real reason that shoes The real reason that shoes are expensive is because we have to have TWO of them. When we look at a pair of six dollar shoes we should think of them individually as three dollars each. That is how the manufacturer must look at them when he figures his cost of material figures his cost of material and labor.

A single shoe at three or three-fifty is a far better value than a hat, a purse, or a necktle at the same price. The shoe must with-stand grinding on cement and yet not blister little feet. It wades through puddles, kicks cans, shinnies up trees and some up emiling with a
