Two Brevard Teenagers To Tell Junior Achievement Story On TV

Two Brevard area teenagers will give television listeners this week an idea of their experiences as heads of business.

Harry Hill, Jr., and Marie Yvonne Hooper, leaders in the 1971-72 Junior Achievement program in Transylvania County, will be guests of Peggy Denny on "Today in the Piedmont." The Greenville Station WFBC program will be telecast on Channel 4 December 30th at 1 p. m.

Gilbert H. Johnson of Olin Corporation, manager of the Junior Achievement program in Transylvania County, will accompany the youths to explain the purposes and accomplishments of the program. They also will demonstrate items manufactured and sold by the four companies.

Miss Hooper, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas L. Hooper of Route 2, Brevard, is president of Duo Company which manufactures and sells candle holders.

Hill is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Hill, Sr. of Hawthorne Drive. He is president of Vodco Company

which makes and sells walnut desk sets. A participant also in the 1970-71 program, he won a week's expense-paid trip to the National Junior Achievement Conference in Indiana as outstanding junior in the Transylvania program.

Heading the other companies are John Mehaffey of Route 1, Pisgah Forest, president of Newco Company which produces and sells ice scrapers; and Buddy Whitmire of Route 2, Horse Shoe, president of Proco Company which also selected candle holders as the product to make and sell.

They are among 98 high school students participating in the four companies which are sponsored by businesses in the area.

Sponsorship is both financial and advisory. In addition to providing funds to support Junior Achievement, area businesses are represented by personnel who serve either on the Board of Directors or as advisors to individual companies.

Olin Corporation provides the four advisors to Newco Company which is co-sponsored by Mitchell - Bissell Com-

pany. RCA Service Company sponsors Vodco Company. The Duo Company is sponsored by Du Pont.

Officers of the board of directors are: J. S. Judson of RCA Service Company, president; Arthur Beddoe and Frank McGiboney of Olin Corporation, vice presidents; Charles Conroy of RCA Service Company, secretary; and J. Mallory Pate of First Union National Bank, treasurer.

Under guidance of the Board of Directors and company advisors, the participants in Junior Achievement programs get a practical course in capitalism. Each company organizes itself along lines of a small-scale business, elects officers, decides on what product to make and sell, determines how to go about it, and issues shares of stock to help finance the program. Eventually, in the wind up of the program, there will be redemption of stock and an orderly closing of business.

As with any public owned company in the free enterprise system, the success or failure of the ventures will be judged by the financial status of the companies.

"The North Carolina General Assembly is a great institution, and I thank the people of this district for having given me the high honor and the privilege of serving them

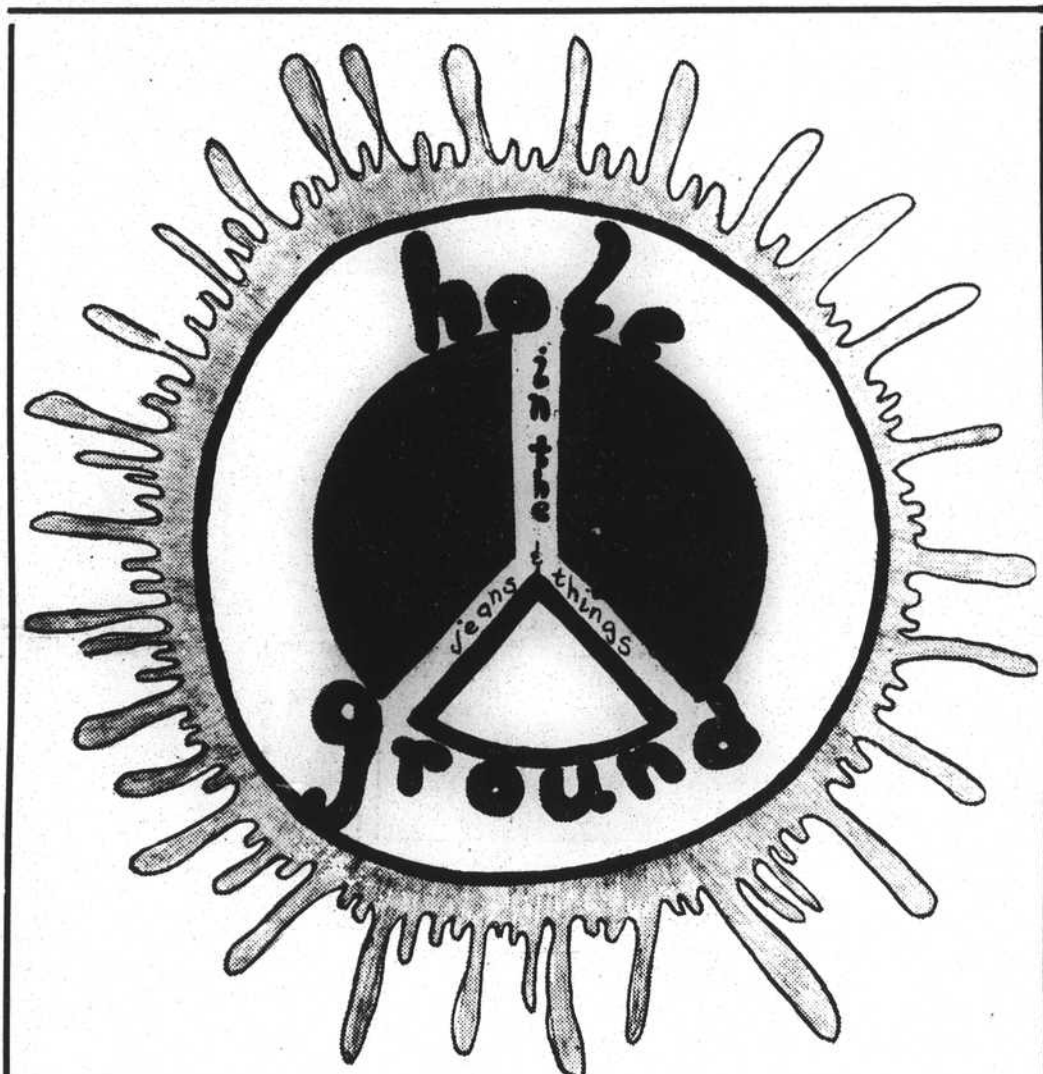
and all the other people of our great State.
