

Brevard Players Win State Paddle Tennis Championship

Jack Mitchell and Clifton Sneedon won the North Carolina Platform Tennis Championship held at Sugar Mountain last weekend.

Mitchell and Sneedon won straight set victories through the Semi-Finals. In the Semi-Finals, they faced another Brevard team, Steve Talmadge and Bob Patterson. Mitchell and Sneedon won 6-4, 6-2.

In the Championship Round, which was a best of five sets match, Mitchell and Sneedon faced Robbie Smith and Tommy Brigham of Sugar Mountain. Mitchell and Sneedon lost the first set 4-6, but won the next three sets 6-2, 6-4, 7-5 for the Championship. The final set was most difficult for the Brevard players. Smith and Brigham won the first four games, the Brevard team won the next game, lost the sixth game at which point the match was 1-5 in favor of the Sugar Mountain team. Mitchell and Sneedon then won six straight games for a 7-5 win and the Championship.

Although this is his first year of Paddle Tennis, Robbie Smith who is the Resident Tennis Professional at Sugar Mountain is the number 3 ranked player in the Professional Tennis Association. His partner, Tommy Brigham, is the son of Dr. Thomas Brigham who is the Developer of the Sugar Mountain Recreation Complex.

All of the Brevard players except Don and Jeff Hill won first round victories against Charlotte, Winston-Salem and Sugar Mountain players. The team of Hill and Hill were unable to continue their match with Smith and Brigham because the senior Hill suffered a recurrence of a knee injury.

The other Brevard players who competed were Dave Kirk and Gordon Tooley, and Nath Thompson and Jim Curwen.
