The certificate can be earned in a short time by those who will begin preparing now, according to W. D. James, Director of the Center.

The Center is located in the Annex at Brevard Junior High School. It is open 1:30 p. m. to 9:30 p. m. on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. Wednesday hours are 8:00 a. m. to 3:30 p. m. and Friday hours are 8:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. Students may schedule their hours to fit

their own convenience since each person learns at his own speed.

Says Mr. James, "3749 people received their High School Equivalency Certificates in North Carolina in 1970. Receive yours in 1972!"

The courses, which lead to the General Educational Development tests, are under the auspices of the Blue Ridge Technical Institute of Hendersonville.
