Editor's note: The 1976 North Carolina General Assembly made 84 changes in the state Criminal Statuteswrote some new laws and As one would expect, eschanged old ones by addition or deletions. Since these laws affect the general public, Brevard's Chief of Police, J. C. Rowe, has collected the changes and THE TIMES is publishing them over the next several months as a public information service. The laws are here published as they appear in the General Statutes; no effort has been made to explain or interpret them. This is a function of the legal profession and the



14-60. Burning of schoolhouses or buildings of educaperson shall wantonly and willfully set fire to or burn or cause to be burned or aid,

14-61. Burning of certain bridges and buildings. — If any peson shall wantonly and willfully set fire to or burn or cause to be burned, or aid, counsel or procure the burning of, any public bridge, or private toll bridge, or the bridge of any incorporated company, or any fire engine house or rescue squad building, or any house belonging to an incorporated company or unincorporated association and used in the business of such company or association, he shall be guilty of a felony, and shall, on conviction, be imprisoned in the State's prison for not less than two nor more than 30 years, and may also be fined in the discretion of the court.

14 - 62. Burning of churches and certain other buildings .-If any person shall wantonly and willfully set fire to or burn

or cause to be burned, or aid, counsel or procure the burning of, any uninhabited house, any church, chapel or meetinghouse, or any stable, coach house, outhouse, warehouse, of-fice, shop, mill, barn or granary, or any building, structure or erection used or intended to be used in carrying on any trade or manufacture, or any branch thereof, whether the same or any of them respectively shall then be in the possession of the offender, or in the possession of any other person, he shall be guilty of a felony, and shall, on conviction, be imprisoned in the State's prison for not less than two or more than 30 years, and may also be fined in the discretion of the


