The Center is located in the Annex at Brevard Junior High School. It is open 1:30 p. m. to 9:30 p. m. on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. Wednesday hours are 8:00 a. m. to 3:30 p. m. and Friday hours are 8:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. Students may schedule their hours to fit

their own convenience since each person learns at his own speed.

Says Mr. James, "3749 people received their High School Equivalency Certificates in North Carolina in 1970. Receive yours in 1972!"

The courses, which lead to the General Educational Development tests, are under the auspices of the Blue Ridge Technical Institute of Hendersonville.

Large Civil War Portrait Of Pvt. James Bracken Is Found

A portrait of a life-long Brevard resident who served with the United States Army during the Civil War was recently discovered in Dallas, Texas, by one of his great-grand children. The 11 x 16 inch picture is of Pvt. James Bracken, who was born in Brevard in 1838, and is a tempera painting over a metal photographic plate.

The picture was probably made between June, 1864, and August, 1865, during which time Bracken served with the 2nd N. C. Mounted Infantry Volunteers in the United States Army. The portrait was carried to Texas by his daughter, Deniza, who married and remained in Texas. The picture is now owned by one of his great-grand daughters.

Bracken's great-grand son, David N. Smith, formerly of Brevard and now of Austin, Texas, learned of the existence of the picture during a conversation with Deniza Bracken's grandson, Justice Bob Shannon, also of Austin. Smith was able to track down the picture and copy it photographically.

A search of the 1890 Special Census of Union Veterans gave information about Bracken and 10 other Brevard Union veterans: Linus North, William N. Nicholson, Isaac Harkins, Samuel McCall, Rhuben Midlock, John E. Smith, William D. Perry, Abe Stepp, Luke Osteen, and James N. Cagle.

Smith, who is compiling a photographic family history, has other pictures of Bracken, and photographs of all his children except two: a son, Dillard, and a daughter, Ella,



who married Luther Hamilton. Smith says he would like to hear from anyone who might have pictures of these members of the family. His address is David N. Smith, 802 Riddlewood, Austin, Texas, 78753.
