The systems method of construction utilizes dimensional structural grade lumber and high strength steel connectors to form an integral structural unit. The exterior walls are a plywood skin covered by rustic wood shake shingles.

The A-frame home which will have 1,410 square feet of living area, consists of eight steel columns from which the entire building is suspended. The span joists and accompanying girder joist work together to form a solid structure at a cost less than conventional construction.
