Last Saturday McAfee had a time of 4:03.2 in winning the mile at the Mason-Dixon Games in Louisville, Ky. That broke the record of 4:04.1 he set Jan. 29.

"Reggie ran a very strong and overpowering race," said Carolina Coach Joe Milton. "He was in complete control against some outstanding opponents from the Soviet Union."

McAfee, a junior from Cincinnati, Ohio, was the national junior college champion in the mile, two-mile and cross country at Brevard College last year.
