It's The New Law

By - J. C. RUWE Chief, Brevard Police

North Carolina General Assembly made 84 changes in the state Criminal Statuteswrote some new laws and changed old ones by addition or deletions. Since these laws affect the general public. Brevard's Chief of Police, J. C. Rowe, has collected the changes and THE TIMES is publishing them over the next several months as a public information service. The laws are here published as they appear in the General Statutes; no effort has been made to explain or interpret them. This is a function of the legal profession and the courts.

14-32. Felonious assault with a firearm or other deadly weapon with intent to kill or in-flecting serious injury: punishments. - (a) Any person who assaults another person with a deadly weapon with intent to kill and inflicts serious injury is guilty of a felony punishable by a fine, imprisonment for not more than ten (10) years, or both such fine and imprison-

(b) Any person who assaults another person with a deadly weapon and inflicts serious injury is guilty of a felony pun-ishable by a fine, imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both such fine and imprisonment.

(c) Any person who assaults another person with a firearm with intent to kill is guilty of a felony punishable by a fine, imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Editor's note: The 1970 (\$50.00) or imprisonment for not more than (30) days.

> (b) Unless his conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, any person who commits any assault, assault and battery, or affray is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500 00), imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both such fine and imprisonment if in the course of such assault, assault, assault and battery, or affray he:

(1) Attempts to inflict serious injury upon another person; or

(2) Assaults a female, he being a male person; or

(3) Assaults a child under the age of twelve (12) vears.

(c) Unless his conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, any person who commits any assault, assault and battery, or affray is pun-ishable by a fine, imprisonment for not more than two (2) years, or both such fine and imprisonment if in the course of such assault, assault and battery, or affray he:

(1) Inflicts serious injury upon another person; or upon another person; or

(2) Uses a deadly weapon;

(3) Intends to kill another

person; or

(4) Assaults a public officer while such officer is discharging or attempting to discharge a duty of

building on 4th Ave. West., The office hours are Tuesday 8:00 "Before any person shall be issued a permit to install or superintend the installation of plumbing in accordance with the regulations of the Transylvania County Board of Health, he shall produce satisfactory evidence that he holds a state qualifying license in accordance with Chapter 7, Article 2, of the General Statutes of North Carolina."

Before any portion of the plumbing and drainage system of any building shall be constructed or before any change, alteration, or additions are made in any existing system, the Plumbing Inspector for Transylvania County

shall be notified and if the proposed new work or altera-tions conform to the require-ments of these rules and regu-

ments of these rules and regu-lations, a written permit shall be issued. After the rough-in test and final inspection, and if the work is found to be in accordance with these rules and regulations, there shall be issued to the person to whom the permit was granted a certificate of approval sign-ed by the Plumbing Inspector.


