

# Baseball Playoffs Underway In Minor And Little Leagues

Teams in the Transylvania Minor and Little Leagues are currently involved in their playoffs, and large crowds have been turning out each evening to see the youngsters battle down to the wire for their respective league championships.

Playoff action started Monday night, and the first round finished Wednesday night. The semi-finals will be played Thursday and Friday night, and the championship games are set for Saturday night, barring weather postponement.

Monday night, the Minor League Astros, trailing 8 to 4 going into the last inning, came up with 12 big runs in that final frame to defeat the Cardinals 16 to 8. The Astros finished the regular season in fifth place, while the Cardinals drew the fourth place slot.

In the second game, the sixth place Colts of the Little League slipped by the third place Mets by a 4 to 1 margin in a real pitchers duel between Rusty Barnes of the Mets and Kevin Norris of the Colts.

Monday's third game saw the first place Giants of the Minor League whip the eighth place Tigers 24 to 3 as the league leaders grabbed an early lead and were in control all the way.

Tuesday night Charlie Parker's Little League Braves, second place finishers in regular season play, had a real battle with the seventh place Panthers before finally edging them 3 to 2. Greg Frisbee was the winning pitcher for the Braves.

In the second game, the Little League Red Sox, who finished regular season play in first place, needed only three innings to down the last place Cardinals 17 to 0. Mitch Stamey was the winning pitcher for the Red Sox.

In the last game Tuesday, Dennis Hamilton's Panthers, who finished regular season play tied for first place with the Giants, had a fine game with the seventh place Yan-

kees before downing them 3 to 1.

First round action concluded Wednesday evening with the Minor League Red Sox, third place finishers, playing the sixth place Braves in the first game. The second game was between the fourth place Little League Cubs and the fifth place Pirates.

The semi-finals start Thursday with the Minor League Astros and Giants meeting at 7 p. m., and the Little League Colts and Braves meeting at 9 p. m.

Friday night, the Little League Red Sox will take on the winner of the Wednesday game between the Cubs and Pirates at 7 p. m.

Friday's 9 p. m. game will send the Minor League Panthers against the winner of Wednesday's game between the Red Sox and the Braves.

The winners of Thursday's and Friday's games will meet for the championship Saturday night, with the Minor League title game slated for 7 p. m., followed by the Little League championship game at 9 p. m.

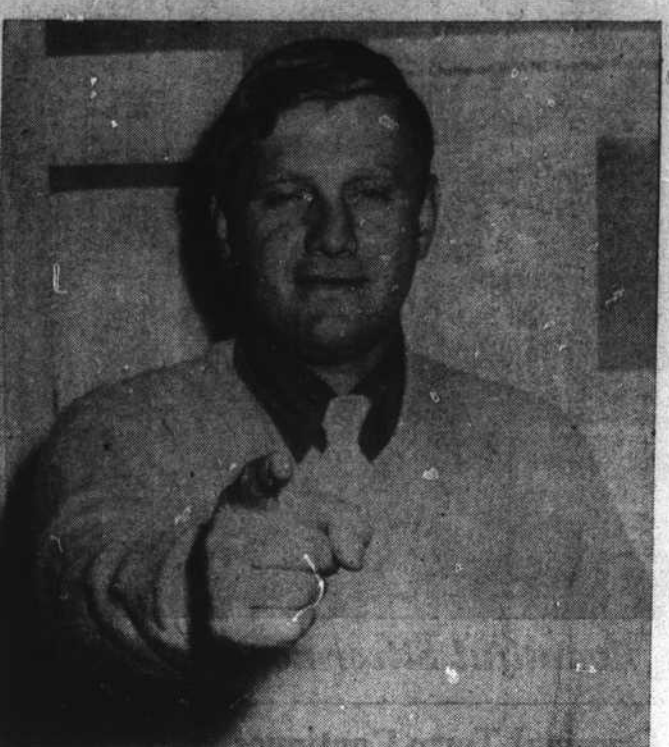
Proceeds from the game go to the endowment fund of the Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children at Greenville, S. C. This year's proceeds are expected to push total contributions to over 5 1/2 million dollars.

Shrine Bowl officials named Roger Thrift of Newbern High, a veteran of 21 years in the coaching field, as head coach of the Tar Heel squad, and Don Hipps of East Mecklenburg High of Charlotte and Coach Emory as assistants.

The South Carolina coaches will be Buddy Neely of Marion, S. C. High, head coach, and assistants Jim Satterfield of Irmo High, and Jimmy Wallace of York High.

Coach Emory came to Brevard in 1969 and his won-loss record here now stands at 26 wins and 6 losses.

He is a graduate of East Carolina University where he averaged 55 minutes of playing time as a guard and tackle for four seasons. He is a native of Lancaster, S. C., and was a prep star at Camden Military Academy.

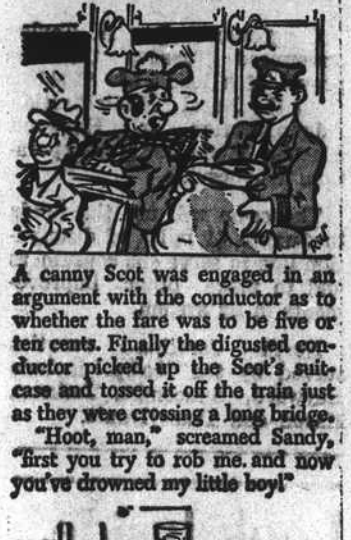
