NOTICE OF SPECIAL BOND ELECTION in the COUNTY OF TRANSYLVANIA NORTH CAROLINA

A special bond election will be held throughout Transylvania County between 6:30 A. M. and 7:30 P. M., on Saturday, September 16, 1972, at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of said County the following question:

Shall an order finally passed on July 17, 1972, authorizing not exceeding \$4,950,000 School Building Bonds of the County of Transylvania for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for erecting additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodeling, enlarging and reconstructing existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquiring necessary land and equipment therefor, in order to provide additional school facilities in said County to maintain the nine months' school term as required by Section 2 of Article IX of the Constitution, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

The question hereinabove set forth contains a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the order referred to in said question.

If said bonds are issued a tax will be levied upon all taxable property in the County of Transylvania for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds.

For said election the regular registration books for elections in the County of Transylvania will be used and the registration books, process or records will continue to be open for the registration of qualified persons and the acceptance of registration applications on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of

each week between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. at the office of the County Board of Elections at the County Courthouse in Brevard, and such days are Challenge Days. The registrars will not attend the voting places except on the date of the election.

The last day for new registration of those not now registered under Transylvania County's permanent registration system is Friday, August 18, 1972. Qualified voters who have moved residence from one precinct or township to another and have not transferred their registration should contact the County Board of Elections at its office at the County Courthouse in Brevard, or any registrar in the County, and transfer their registration.

The last day of transferring registration is Friday, August 18, 1972.

Any qualified voter of the County who is qualified to vote by absentee ballot under the provisions of the General Statutes of North Carolina, particularly Article 20 of Chapter 163, in a State-wide general election is authorized to vote an absentee ballot on said bond question in accordance with said provisions of the General Statutes relating to absentee voting. Any qualified voter of the County who is qualified to vote by absentee ballot in said election may apply for an absentee ballot not earlier than forty-five days prior to said election and not later than 6:00 P. M., Wednesday, September 13, 1972, at the office of the Transylvania County Board of Elections mentioned above.

Qualified voters who are not certain whether they are registered should contact the County Board of Elections at the office of said Board in Brevard mentioned above.
