All misbehavior (for children under 10) is the result of a child's mistaken notion about the way to find a place in his group (family, school, class) and to gain status.

When the adult is not aware of the meaning (goal) of the child's misbehavior, he responds by falling for the child's scheme (mistaken goal) and thus reinforces this unacceptable behavior.

The parent or teacher has to recognize misbehavior patterns and their hidden pools. Four goals have been identified that are the basis for all misbehavior of children under ten: 1) attention getting, 2) struggle for power, 3(revenge, and 4) using disability as an excuse (cop-out).

In subsequent articles we will look at case histories of these mistaken goals of behavior thelp in recognizing them as they occur and know how to effectively deal with them.

Remember to be human is to desire to missate (love, friendship) with other particularly to know and appreciate of the and to have a recognized class to oup (family, school, the world).

Also, encouragement from others is an absolute essential ingredient to human well being as we stumble and trip through life.

All of this is of supreme in young child whose personality formed by five or six.
