Coach Ed Emory of Brevard high school has released the 1973 grid schedule for his Blue Devils that promises to be the toughest and most exciting in the school's history.

The Blue Devils will open on August 31st against rugged T. C. Roberson there, and will close, barring play-off competition, on November 2nd at Enka.

But between those two games, the Blue Devils will be facing some of the toughest prep powers in the area, including two new foes in Spartanburg, S. C. High, and the Asheville High Cougars.

Spartanburg and Asheville are replacing Swain High and Glen Alpine on Brevard's schedule this year.

Throw these two in with perennial toughies Tuscola, Pisgah and Hendersonville, and add North Buncombe, East Henderson and Erwin, and you have a schedule that will give the Blue Devils little cause for resting on their laurels from week to week.

If there is any breather on the schedule, it might be considered the Erwin game that is sandwiched in between Pisgah and Asheville. That's a good spot for it to come.

The complete schedule: August 31, at T. C. Roberson; Sept. 7, Tuscola here; Sept. 14, at Spartanburg; Sept. 21, North Buncombe, here; Sept. 28, Hendersonville, here; Oct. 12, at Pisgah; Oct. 19, at Erwin; Oct. 26, Asheville, here; Nov. 2, at Enka.

Also competing for the Transylvania County School system and Recreation Department was Dwayne Norman and Tim Pruitt.

Craig Freas of the Recreation Department was coach for the team of students representing Rosman high, Brevard high and Brevard Junior High Schools. Special Education teachers aiding with chaperoning and other aspects were Betty Portman of the Rosman Schools and Mrs. Rebecca Huggins of Brevard High School.

Over 500 students participated in the event sponsored nationally by the Kennedy Foundation. The students qualified for the State Meet after a fine showing in the Regional Meet, held at Western Carolina University last month.

Brevard College basketball coach, John Meyerhoff, announces the signing of his fourth prospect for the Brevard Tornadoes basketball team.

This time, it was James Slee, a 6'7 1/2" forward - center from Hanover, Pennsylvania.

Slee is a product of DeLone Catholic High School in McSherrystown, Pennsylvania. He played one year of prep ball against Junior College and Junior Varsity competition for Frederick Military Academy in Virginia. While there, he averaged a healthy 13 points and 12 rebounds per game while shooting nearly 52 percent from the floor.

"Jim is a fine college prospect," said Coach Meyerhoff. "He has excellent mobility and ball handling ability for a player his size." Teamed with 6'5 1/2" Bryan Jones, who signed last week, the Tornadoes should experience some success under the boards. Meyerhoff has now signed one player each from North Carolina, Virginia, Pennsylvania and New York.
