Capt. Glazener Is Recognized

U. S. Air Force Captain Wayne H. Glazener, son of Mr. and Mrs. James B. Glazener, Rt. 1, Brevard, has been recognized for his participation in Operation Linebacker II, the successful air campaign last December against key military targets in North Vietnam.

Members of USAF's Eighth and Seventh Air Forces and U. S. Navy Task Force 77 who carried out the operation have received and coveted Collier Trophy for 1972. During the campaign, Captain Glazener served as a B-52 Stratofortress navigator with the Eighth which is headquartered at Andersen AFB, Guam. He is assigned permanently to the 96th Bomb Wing at Dyess AFB, Tex.

The 27 aerospace leaders and authorities serving on the Collier Selection Committee of the National Aeronautic Association unanimously selected Operation Linebacker as the greatest achievement in aeronautics or astronautics of the year. The committee cited the campaign as a crucial and decisive factor leading to the return of U. S. prisoners of war and the attainment of other principal U. S. objectives.

Admiral Thomas J. Moorer, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, recently accepted the award in Washington in behalf of all military units involved.

Captain Glazener attended Brevard Senior High School and received his B.S. degree in 1969 from Western Carolina University, Cullowhee.

He was commissioned in 1970 upon completion of Officer Training School at Lackland AFB, Tex. The captain's wife, Irene, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Felipe Garcia of Rt. 1, Cimarron, N. M.

Vagabonds To Hold Drama State Privilege Workshop For Teachers Licenses Are Due

The Vagabond School of the Drama, in association with the State Department of Public Instruction, announces its ninth annual Summer Drama Workshop for Teachers, to be held July 9th to 20th at Flat Rock Playhouse, the State Theatre of North Carolina.

The two-week session will feature lectures, demonstrations, discussion periods, observation of the apprentice training program and children's classes at the Playhouse, and practical laboratory work. En-

rollees are also invited to attend rehearsals and performances of the Vagabond Players, which is a professional Equity company.

For the fourth consecutive summer, the course will be under the direction of Ellen Kelly, who joined the Vagabond staff in 1968. Miss Kelly was formerly with the famous Henry Street Playhouse company in New York City, and a member of their teaching faculty working primarily with young people.

Teachers in the North Carolina public schools may attend the Workshop tuition free, and obtain two hours of non-college credit for first or second certificate renewal.

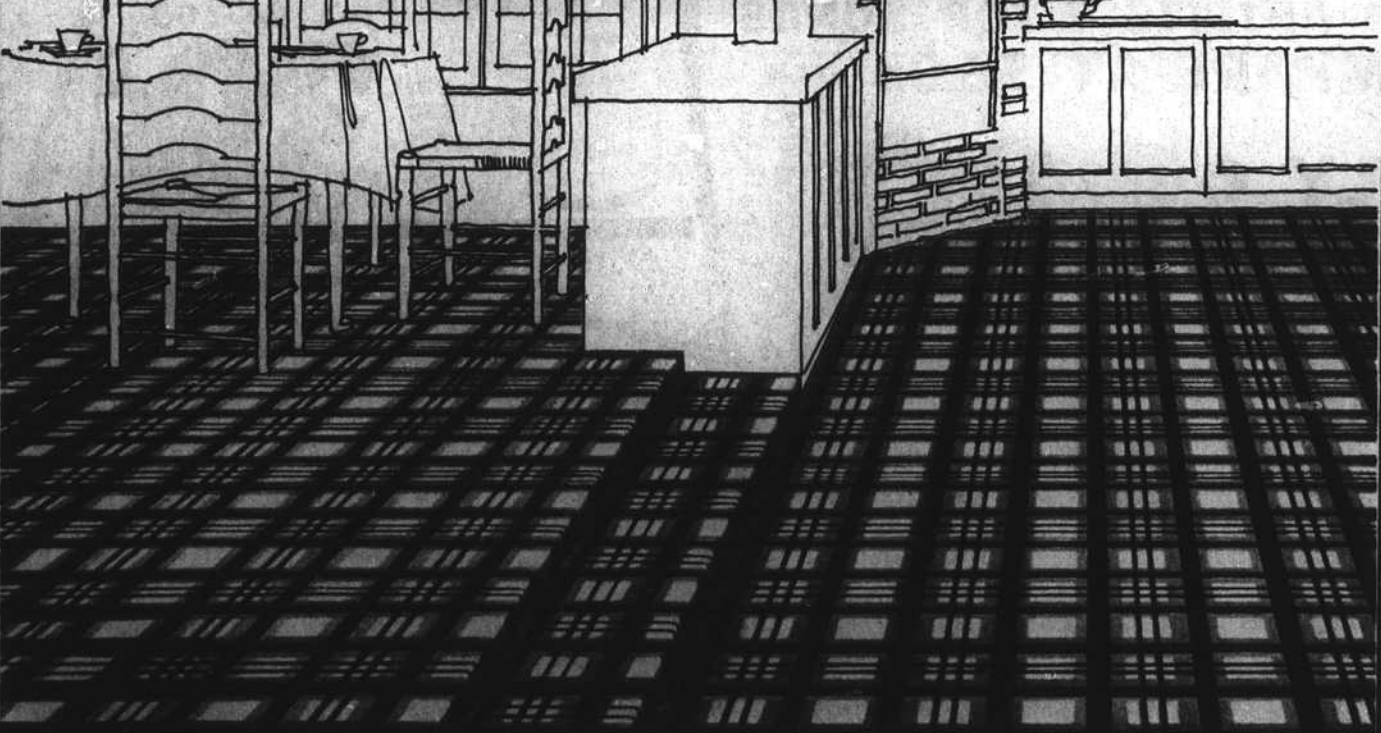

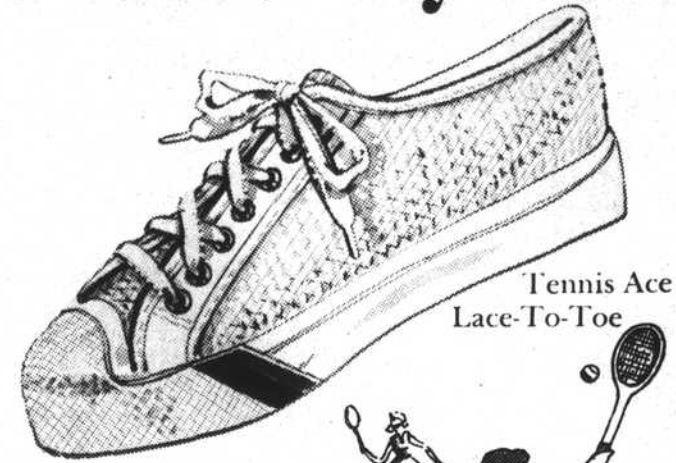

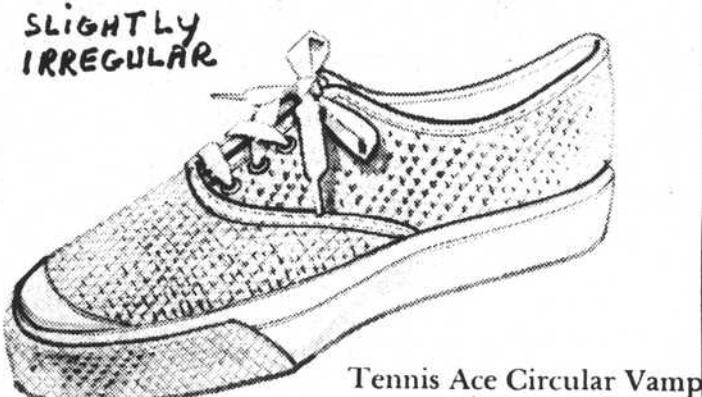
