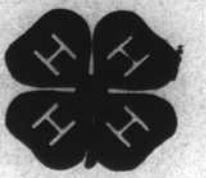
Prizes in the Youth Art Contest will be given in two categories and two age groups:

18th 4-H Leadership Conference

Four Senior boys and four senior girls from Transylvania County are encouraged to attend the 18th 4-H Leadership Conference at Swannanoa 4-H Camp on August 6th - 11th. Members will have the chance to take part in four special interest groups such as crafts, recreation, leadership, defensive driving and art workshops.

Each delegate will have the opportunity to attend and participate in the following workshops: Leadership, Youth and the Law, Wonder Where the Money Went, and The Adventure of People.

The cost is \$23.00 per delegate and agent. The cost covers food, lodging and insurance. Craft supplies will be in addition to the \$23.00. Each delegate will pay for the craft supplies he uses. In previous years, a number of counties have arranged scholarships for their delegates.

The week's activities will include vesper programs, varied

recreation, talks on topics of particular interest to young people, a variety of special interest topics and an opportunity for you to develop interests you have had little chance to explore.

College Scholarships For Girls Majoring In Home Economics

Four scholarships, totaling \$3,200, are being offered to college home economics majors, according to the National 4-H Service Committee, Chicago.

Present or former 4-H members, who are entering their junior year in the fall of 1973 for these awards. Provided by who plan to major in home economics are eligible to apply The S&H Foundation, Inc., and The West Bend Company, each donor funds two \$800 scholarships.

State 4-H leaders and county extension offices can provide the special application forms and advise candidates of

closing dates for accepting the forms and supporting materials.

The Cooperative Extension Service, which supervises 4-H programs, selects the winners on the basis of their interest and desire to major in home economics, financial need, scholastic record and all around work in 4-H.

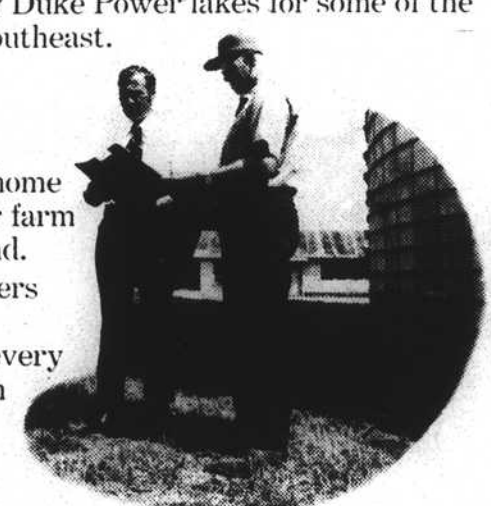
