Groundbreaking For Addition To Pisgah Forest Church Held

On July 1, 1973, ground was broken by the Pisgah Forest Baptist Church for an addition to their present structure. The building, consisting of classrooms, fellowship hall and preschool facilities, will make up the second stage of a three-stage building plan begun when the church moved from its original site on Deavor Road to its new location on US Highway 64 in 1966.

Participating in the groundbreaking ceremony were D. H. Orr, Kenneth Sentelle, Howard Wilkie, Steve Cochran, Robert Daniels, (Architect), Jim Phillips, Bill Case, chairman of the Building Committee, Rev. Wayne Blackwood, pastor, and

Valry Carter who turned the first shovel of dirt.

Prior to the groundbreaking, Mr. Orr, who is the oldest deacon of the church, spoke of the abundant faith of the members of the church and challenged them all to a greater faith in the coming years for the service of Christ in Transylvania County.

After the ceremony, the congregation enjoyed a fellowship dinner on the grounds.

The church has been striving toward a Building Fund and special offerings have been taken on several occasions. Included in this emphasis was a "Buy a Brick" campaign during which 35,000 bricks were sold. The building fund grew to \$42,000 during this time.
