All members and visiting Nobels are invited.

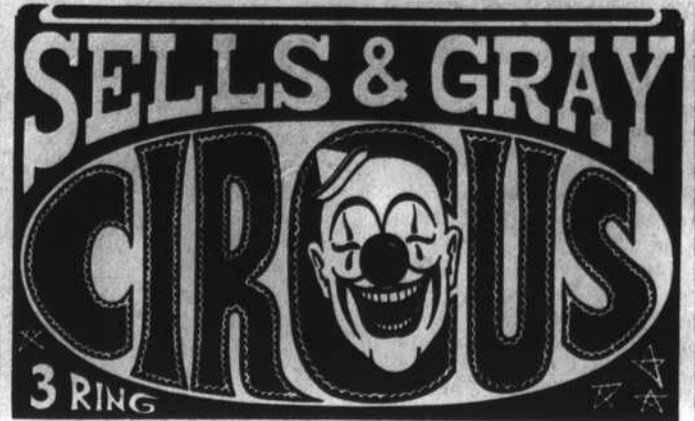
