Breedlove is enlisting the support of numerous civic leaders and other residents to formulate plans for the premiere.

According to Mr. Breedlove, "Time To Run" is a new feature-length color release from the Billy Graham Film Ministry studios. He said he believes "the film will have an im-

Further confrontations develop between the young man and his girl friend when she becomes involved in the 'Jesus Movement.' The viewer encounters moments of humor, suspense and warmth throughout the film."

Mr. Breedlove, who lives on Route 3, Morgan Heights, is associated with the Wesleyan Church. In preparation for the premiere, he attended a special two-day seminar.
