After Renovation

Brevard Elks Club To Hold Grand Opening November 3rd

The Brevard Lodge No. 1768, B.P.O.E. will hold a Grand Opening the evening of Nov. 3rd, according to an announcement this week by Jud McCrary, Exalted Ruler.

All lodge members are urged to come.

Activities begin at 6:00 p. m. to be followed by a Roast Prime Rib of Beef dinner at 7:00 p. m. Dancing will begin at 9:00 p. m. and continue until 1:00 a. m.

Music will be furnished by the Four Seasons.

Cost will be \$10.00 per couple.

The occasion will also include a celebration of the birthday of Mr. Edell Fraser. Founder of the Brevard Elks club, Mr. Fraser will be 90 years old Nov. 3rd.

The Elks Club has been recently renovated at a cost of \$30,000. The entire upstairs has been redone with new lights, heating, plumbing, air conditioning, furniture and carpeting. The kitchen has also been redone with such new equipment.

The renovation, which began in July, has provided approximately twice the original room for the use of the club's 300 members, according to Mr. McCrary.

Founded in 1949, the Elks club first was housed in the old Country Club, then in what is now the Colonial Inn; and finally in its present quarters, the beautiful old wood house on Elks Club Road.

The historic old house was built in 1888 by Thomas S. Wood, a prominent Brevard farmer who came here in 1869 from Scotland. The old mansion, with its original 12 rooms and 12 fireplaces, passed to Mrs. Alice Wood Paxton, who sold it to a real estate company in 1926. It was used as a private home for several years after that before being purchased by the Elks.

Dear Fellow Citizens:

On Tuesday, November 6, I ask you to vote "For" passage of the \$300 million School Bond Referendum. This money is desperately needed for construction, renovation and repair of school facilities. Please consider these facts:

1. If the School Bond Referendum is approved, the Transylvania County Schools will receive \$1,145,548.29.
2. The money allocated to our school administrative unit is a direct grant from the State. It DOES NOT have to be repaid by Transylvania County.
3. PASSAGE OF THE BOND ISSUE WILL NOT REQUIRE AN INCREASE IN STATE TAXES. North Carolina can afford to issue these bonds under its present tax structure.
4. PASSAGE OF THE BOND ISSUE MEANS THAT LESS MONEY WILL BE NEEDED FROM LOCAL TAXES FOR FUTURE IMPROVEMENT OF FACILITIES.
