



Dear Fellow Citizens:

On Tuesday, November 6, I ask you to vote "For" passage of the \$300 million School Bond Referendum. This money is desperately needed for construction, renovation and repair of school facilities. Please consider these facts:

- 1. If the School Bond Referendum is approved, the Transylvania County Schools will receive \$1,145,548.29.
- 2. The money allocated to our school administrative unit is a direct grant from the State. It DOES NOT have to be repaid by Transylvania County.
- 3. PASSAGE OF THE BOND ISSUE WILL NOT REQUIRE AN INCREASE IN STATE TAXES. North Carolina can afford to issue these bonds under its present tax structure.
- 4. PASSAGE OF THE BOND ISSUE MEANS THAT LESS MONEY WILL BE NEEDED FROM LOCAL TAXES FOR FUTURE IMPROVEMENT OF
