

# Blue Devil Wrestlers Win Big Western Carolina Invitational

The Brevard Blue Devils won their second consecutive Western Carolina Invitational Wrestling Tournament at Tuscola's gym last Saturday night, as they whipped favored T. C. Robinson by a 4 1/2 points, 103 to 99 1/2.

Other team standings include: A. C. Reynolds, 91; Enka, 82 1/2; Tuscola, 63; Hendersonville, 78; Owen, 74; Sylvanester, 73; Spruce Pine, 59; East Henderson, 28; and Erwin, 6.

Undefeated freshman Norman Masterson set the pace for the Blue Devils as he marched unblemished through the tough turny to win the A Division, 100 pound classification.

Other first place finishers for Brevard included Mike Owen, A Division, 121 pound class; William Watkins, B Division, 134 pound class; and Sidney Whitaker, D Division Heavyweight class.

As a team Brevard did well overall, scoring points in almost every classification.

Morris Avery placed second in the B Division, 107 pound class, James Rahn, second in B Div., 128 pound class; Jeff Brookshire, third in B Div., 140 pound class; Garland Powell, second in B Div., 147 pound class; Robert Greer, third in B Div., 157 pound class; Terry Avery, third in A Div., 169 pound class; Frank Robinson, second in A Div., 187 pound class; and Clint Cox finished fourth in B Div., 197 pound class to conclude Brevard's scoring.

"This was a great individual and team effort," Coach Frank Robinson stated, "And I'm extremely proud of the way that every team member performed against real tough opposition. We're getting our confidence now, and I think Brevard is going to be real tough to handle from here on out," he concluded.

## Tornadoes Whip Spartanburg, Lose To Mitchell In Upset

The Brevard College Tornadoes split their last two games, whipping Spartanburg here last Saturday night, but losing in a big upset to Mitchell at Statesville Tuesday night.

Saturday night, Brevard whipped Spartanburg 85-83 as Ron Jones hit two free throws with two seconds remaining. Jones also led the Tornado attack with 26 points.

Tuesday night at Statesville, Mitchell grabbed an early lead and held on to forestall a last minute spurt by the Tornadoes to win 77-74. Jones was again high for Brevard with 20 points.

The loss dropped Brevard's Western Carolinas Junior College Conference record to four wins and five losses, and their overall record to nine wins and eleven losses.

Brevard College Roadrunners placed five men in their first indoor meet of the season at Knoxville, Tennessee, on Saturday, January 26th. There were 12 schools represented with Brevard being the only Junior College.

Even though it was the first meet, some individuals ran well with many of the freshmen having troubles negotiating the sharp turns. While times and jumps were relatively poor, Brevard did make its presence known.

Brevard's only first place came from highly ranked Charles Robinson in the triple jump with a jump of 46' 7 1/2". Brevard's strength seemed to be in the hurdles with Mike Anderson placing fourth with Ed Manley sixth. Jeff Wright made it to the semi-finals and just missed the finals in a close race. Brevard's other places came from Don Appel in the shot at 40' 11", placing him seventh and by Ed Chandler in the 800 finishing 6th.

With most of the distance crew training more for outdoors, Mike Bailey seemed to be the only one ready for indoor competition. Though he did not place, his time of 9:39.9 in the 2 mile was a relatively good time on that track.

Brevard will now train for Montgomery, Alabama, February 8th. Those making the trip will be: Mike Bailey, Mike Anderson, Ed Chandler, Ed Manley and Charles Robinson.

## Blue Devils Beat Black Hawks, But Girls Lose, Jayvees Win

The Brevard Blue Devils put one all together here last Friday night as they took the measure of rugged North Buncombe 64-60. The upset win was only Brevard's second of the current campaign.

North Buncombe's girls returned the favor, however, as they upset Brevard's girls in a stunner, 36-32, for their fourth loss of the year.

Distributive point output was the story for the Blue Devils as they whipped the Black Hawks. Bobby Arnett was high with 15 points, but he got ample support from Dale Griffin with 14 and James Duckett with 12.

Joyce Patterson was high for the girls with 12 points, but she was the only Blue Devilette in double figures.

Brevard's Jayvees, getting better all the time, whipped North Buncombe's Jayvees 53-

47 in the preliminary contest. Brevard traveled to West Henderson Saturday night, with the boys losing and the girls returning to their winning ways.

The Falcons, who have wrapped up the Blue Ridge Conference regular season championship, had little trouble with the Blue Devils as they romped to a convincing 71-45 win. Griffin and Arnett again shared scoring honors for Brevard with 14 and 12 points respectively.

Brevard's girls counted on the two-pronged scoring attack of Lynn Avery and Rhonda Harris to pull out their win over West Henderson by 50-42. The two scored 13 and 10 points respectively to get the Blue Devils back on the winning track.

Brevard's Jayvees won again as they whipped West's Jayvees 52-45.

Tuesday night, East Hender-

son used accuracy at the free-throw line to pull them through over Brevard by a narrow 66-62 score. The Eagles hit 8 of 12 foul shots in the final period and 16 of 21 overall to edge the Blue Devils in Parkway Division play.

Dale Griffin was high point man for Brevard with 15, but Bellefeuille and Fortune were also in double figures with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Brevard's girls won another close one as they downed the East Henderson lassies 49-45.

Joyce Patterson and Cindy Brookshire had 13 and 11 points respectively to lead the way for the win.

Brevard's red-hot Jayvees made it three straight as they ran all over the East Henderson Jayvees by a whooping 40 point spread, 74-34.

## Senator Taylor To Propose More Wildlife Protectors

State Senator Charles H. Taylor told a group of sportsmen meeting here last Saturday morning in the Court House that he would ask the state wildlife commission for additional wildlife protectors for the 9th Wildlife District comprised of the state's 12 westernmost counties.

Mr. Taylor stated that his request would be the first of a three-part request he would make of the Wildlife Commission in order to secure greater protection for wildlife in the mountain region. In addition to increased protection, he stated that he would ask the Commission to devise a system of utilizing sportsmen to assist protectors in providing protection in this vast and rugged geographical area.

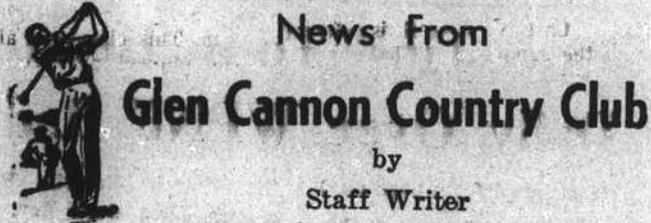
"This plan is not a device to create a band of vigilantes operating independently, but an attempt to devise a system whereby sportsmen would increase the efficiency and enforcement of wildlife regulations," he said.

A third proposal Rep. Taylor will submit to the Commission is a request that they initiate a study of the other state's enforcement procedures to see if they can thereby find other ways of increasing protection for the wildlife in the mountain counties.

Mr. Taylor stated that his concern has arisen from the growing number of sportsmen who have provided him with information outlining numerous instances of violation of regulations and abuse of wildlife on areas supposed to be protected during the closed seasons. It is extremely difficult to get convictions unless violations are witnessed firsthand with sufficient evidence for a conviction being observed.

He encouraged sportsmen to attend hearings and trials of wildlife violators and observe the sincerity with which court officers carried out their duties. Taylor stated, "I have an optimism of the majority of wildlife protectors in the region since each of these men has an impossible task of trying to protect wildlife on a 24-hour basis. I think they do a remarkably good job considering their difficult job."

Mr. Taylor stated that his concern has arisen from the growing number of sportsmen who have provided him with information outlining numerous instances of violation of regulations and abuse of wildlife on areas supposed to be protected during the closed seasons. It is extremely difficult to get convictions unless violations are witnessed firsthand with sufficient evidence for a conviction being observed.
