The Ecusta plant grew from an industry employing 400 persons in 1939 with an annual navroll of slightly over \$1,000,000, to an industrial complex emploving more than 2,500 persons and an annual payroll in excess of \$25,000,000.

Ecusta's four paper machines had grown to nine cigarette paper machines before Fcusta was acquired by Olin Industries in 1949. In the years to follow, expansion saw installation of three of the world's largest Fourdrinier paper machines for
