Wax Scale And Its Control
Wax scales are among the most difficult ornamental plant pests to control. Adult scales are a quarter of an inch in diameter and are covered with a thick, white, sticky wax which protects them from the environment and pesticides.

Beginning in March wax scales lay 100 to 2000 eggs. By late May tiny crawlers emerge

and move about, searching for a place to feed. Feeding occurs along the twigs and occasionally along the midribs of leaves of numerous woody ornamental plants. Once the crawlers insert their sucking mouthparts into the host plant, they are incapable of moving. After moulting, the tiny scale begins to secrete its waxy covering from which it gets its name. The young scales mature throughout the summer, and as the waxy covering is produced, they become increasingly tolerant to pesticides. Wax scales overwinter as adults; there is only one generation per year.

Control: Handpicking in winter (if practical) is an effective control measure. As scales may lay their eggs even though removed from their host plants, they should be destroyed after removal. Because the crawlers emerge from under their mothers protective wax coating for two or three weeks and because our recommended pesticides do not persist in the environment, repeat applications of whichever pesticide is used must be made. Unless pesticides are applied within a month after the crawlers emerge, control will be incomplete at best. Apply one of the following pesticides two or three times at ten day intervals starting about June 15th.

Cygon, De-Fend (dimethoate) 26.7% emulsifiable concentrate - 4 teaspoons per gallon of water. May injure some varieties of azalea and Japanese and Chinese holly. Do not use on plants not listed on label.
Eosin + oil emulsifiable concentrate - 4 tablespoons per gallon of water. malathion 50 to 75% emulsifiable concentrate - 1 tablespoon per gallon of water. Spectracide (diazinon) 25% emulsifiable concentrate - 2 teaspoons per gallon of water - summer oil + malathion - 5 tablespoons + 2 teaspoons per gallon of water. Zectran 22.7% emulsifiable concentrate - 3 teaspoons per gallon of water.

Horses - Wee And Eee
Horse owners in Transylvania County are urged to get their animals vaccinated for equine encephalomyelitis. Horse sleeping sickness, of one type or another, is often a serious problem as mosquito populations increase during summer months.

Horse owners should see their veterinarians now about vaccination to protect against Eastern and Western equine encephalomyelitis (EEE and WEE) for maximum protection during the mosquito season.

These diseases are similar in effect but caused by different viruses. They are transmitted by mosquitoes, and can also affect humans.

Effective vaccines are available for both.

EEE and WEE have been known in the U. S. for many years. As recently as the 1930's epidemics of these diseases caused severe losses. Development of effective vaccines has greatly reduced the severity of EEE and WEE outbreaks. But, outbreaks occurred in some 25 states last summer killing or maiming many animals that could have been saved had they been protected by vaccination.
