MOUSSE MARIETTE - OOH LA LA!

When you fold billowy egg whites and whipped cream into a cognac-flavored, custardy sauce, you have the makings of a superb mousse. MOUSSE MARIETTE Makes 8 servings

1	envelopes (2 tablespoons)	2 tablespoons cognac
	unflavored gelatine	1 teaspoon vanilla
1/3	cup water	1 cup ground 100% natura
	cups milk	cereal
	eggs, separated	1 cup whipping cream,
1	cup sugar	whipped

Soften gelatine in water. Heat milk in a heavy saucepan and stir in the gelatine until dissolved. Beat the egg yolks and sugar until light and fluffy and stir into hot milk gradually. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until mixture coats a spoon, but do not boil. Remove from heat and stir in cognac, vanilla and ground natural cereal. Chill until partially set.

Beat egg whites until stiff, but not dry and fold into natural cereal mixture. Fold in whipped cream and pour into a 5-cup souffle dish with 4-inch collar of waxed paper tied around out-side top. Chill until set. Remove collar and garnish top of mousse with 100% natural cercal.


