Because of a Las Vegas booking, Miss Phyllis Diller's performance date at Brevard Music Center has been rescheduled to Saturday, August 10th at 8:15 p.m.

Accordingly, the pops concert, "An Evening with Frank Loesser," has been changed to Saturday, July 27th, at 8:15 p.m.

Persons who have purchased advance tickets to the performances are being notified by direct mail of the changes, according to General Manager Robert G. Cole.

Miss Diller will perform with the Brevard Music Center Symphony Orchestra. An accomplished pianist, she will play the works of five classical composers and present a

Considered America's most versatile comedienne, Miss Diller is famous for her stand-up monologues and comedy style. She has hosted two network television programs and is a regular performer on many of the top television variety and family shows.

A facet of her many talents virtually unknown to the general public is her artistry as a concert pianist. She regularly performs with leading symphony orchestras and has been hailed for her outstanding classical works.

Choral works scheduled are Beethoven's Ninth Symphony, Bach's St. John's Passion, and Verdi's Requiem.

Brevard's 1974 concert season opens July 5th and extends through August 18th.

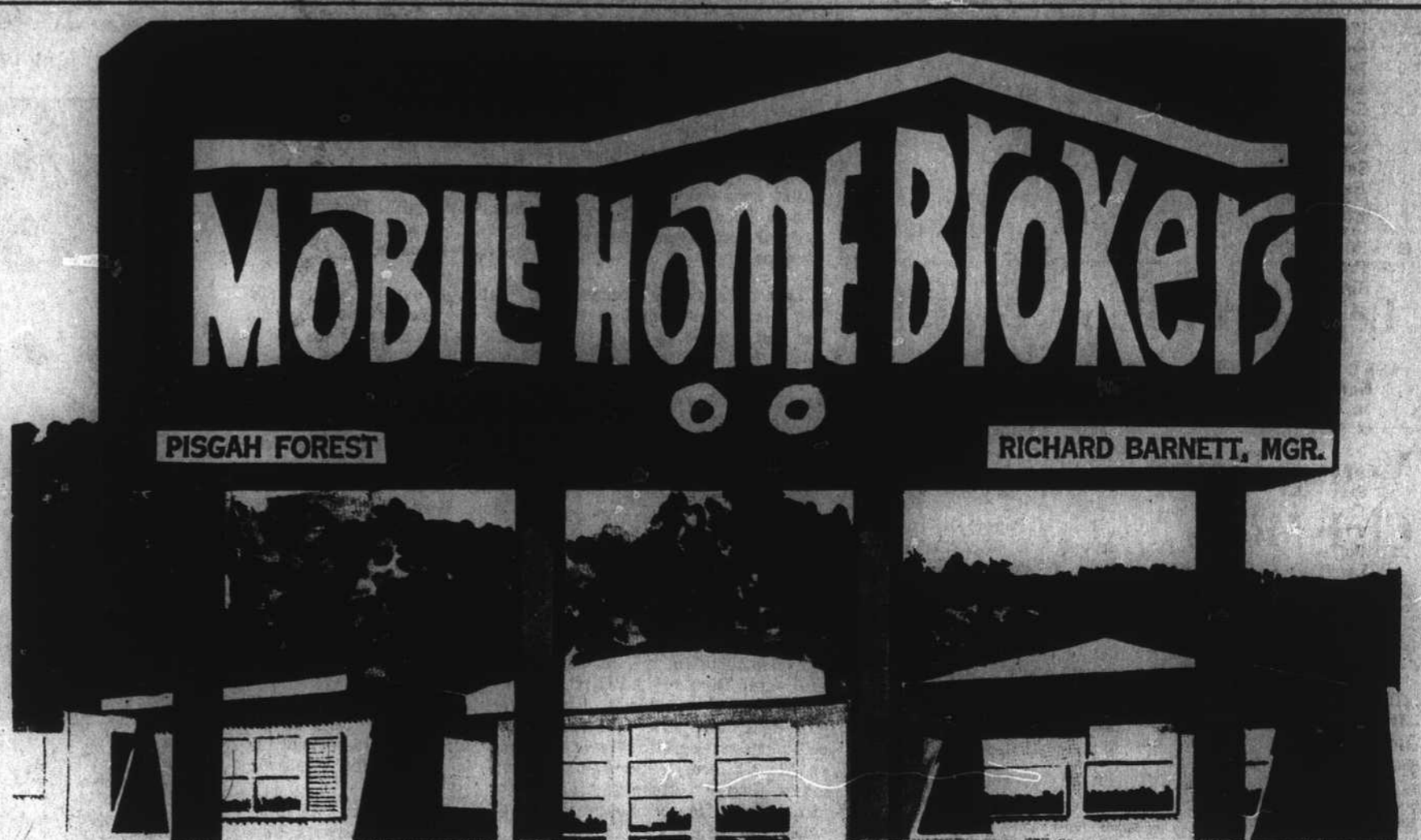
